**RESOLUTION NO. 2015-020**

Authorizing Multnomah County to Opt Out of Community Dispute Resolution Request for Applications and Selection of Grant Recipient Process for the 2015-2017 Biennium.

**The Multnomah County Board of Commissioners Finds:**

- a. The State of Oregon budget provides an appropriation for the Community Dispute Resolution Program, to ensure access to dispute resolution services in each county.
- b. ORS 36.160 directs Counties to determine whether to have the University of Oregon, School of Law administer these funds or to conduct procurement and contract monitoring using County resources.
- c. Multnomah County's portion of Community Dispute Resolution Program funds have been administered through the University of Oregon, School of Law in an efficient and effective manner and served the needs of county residents.

**The Multnomah County Board of Commissioners Resolves:**

1. The County Chair is authorized to execute the attached Exhibit A which allows Multnomah County to opt out of participating in the expenditure of funds for community dispute resolution programs funded under ORS 36.155 for the 2015-2017 grant cycle.



**EXECUTIVE RULE NO. 366**


**Delegation of Signing Authority**

- a. Under section 6.10(7) of the Multnomah County Home Rule Charter, the Chair may delegate administrative powers but shall retain full responsibility for the acts of subordinates.
- b. The efficient operation of County business occasionally requires the Chair's signature on official documents in the Chair's absence or unavailability.


The following Executive Rule is adopted:

- 1. Marissa Madrigal and Nancy Bennett are authorized to sign the Chair's name to orders, contracts and other official documents requiring the Chair's signature.
- 2. Authorized signature will appear as the signature of the Multnomah County Chair followed by initials of the delegate.
- 3. This Executive Rule rescinds Executive Rule 363.
- 4. This Executive Rule shall remain in effect until rescinded or modified.
