RESOLUTION NO. 02-023

Approving Submittal of County Sponsored Projects for 2002 Needs and Issues Inventory

The Multnomah County Board of Commissioners Finds:

- a) The Oregon Economic and Community Development Department (OECDD) compiles a Needs and Issues Inventory (Inventory) on an annual basis.
- b) This is the first year in which OECDD has requested such a list from Multnomah County to include both urban and rural projects in the categories of infrastructure, community services, and community resources.
- c) Multnomah County, along with incorporated cities, tribes, and ports within the County are eligible to be sponsoring agencies for projects.
- d) Multnomah County is the designated sponsor for rural areas in the County and for projects spanning jurisdictions.
- e) The Inventory will be used by OECDD and other state and federal agencies to quantify and classify overall community and economic development needs, to guide funding decisions, and to identify lead agencies to work with communities on planning, technical assistance, and resources.
- f) The list of projects sponsored by Multnomah County includes identification of top priority projects within categories as required by federal agencies.
- g) Multnomah County, and particularly rural communities within the County, may benefit greatly from the attention generated by inclusion of projects in the Inventory.

The Multnomah County Board of Commissioners Resolves:

- 1. The attached 2002 Needs and Issues Inventory Local Priority List dated February 14, 2002 is approved for submittal to OECDD.
