General

Emergency Operations Center (EOC) Updates

- Situation Reports will be released daily around 6:00 pm.
- Internal and external liaisons have been activated to support the community.
- > The Multnomah County Health Department has targeted guidance under development for long-term care facilities which should be available very soon. This guidance will support seniors with practices to prevent virus spread to some of Multnomah County's most medically vulnerable residents.
- > Guidance documents have been completed and posted on the county COVID-19 website for food-service providers, [social service and non-profit agencies](#), [small health clinics](#), [large gatherings](#), and [congregate and shelter settings](#). These guidance documents will help keep clients and guests safe and protect staff and employees.
- > New content has been added to the website, keeping the COVID-19 page active and current and amplifying important messages. Updated pages discuss:

 - [Handwashing](#)
 - [Using Masks](#)
- For organizations looking to prepare, we encourage you to use and share the tabletop exercise template posted ([click here](#)) on the County website. This tool uses a hypothetical yet realistic scenario developed by Multnomah County to help organizations accomplish contingency planning through a facilitated discussion.
- Media requests continue to come in throughout the day from local, state, and national outlets, and the Public Information Unit is filling these requests with available experts as they come.
 - > Media interest focused on local-state agency coordination, guidance regarding shelters and unhoused county residents, and mental health support.

- Culturally-specific emergency preparedness advocates are reviewing scripts for a series of videos that will be posted to the webpage and promoted on social media.
- >Videos are being developed in Spanish, Vietnamese, Chinese, Russian, and Somali, with other languages being planned. The videos should be completed and available next week. Interviews were also held with culturally-specific outlets, including Spanish-language media.
- >Community partners were identified for the process of creating health promotion materials for people experiencing homelessness in camps.
- >Homeless Shelter and Day Center guidance was developed and disseminated to shelter providers with an aim of preventing transmission.
- >A community health and culturally specific provider workshop will be held Thursday, March 5 at the Portland State Office Building in Portland from 9:00am-Noon.
- >The Multnomah County Emergency Operations Center will be moving into a larger space in the Gladys McCoy Building, reflecting the expanded activity of the incident response.

Emergency Support Function 1: Transportation

- Trimet has posted an advisory on their website asking riders to help prevent the spread of coronavirus: See the advisory [here](#).

Emergency Support Function 7: Resource Support

- >The County Logistics Section is coordinating with the State of Oregon to acquire N95 respirators and other Personal Protective Equipment.
- Logistics Section continues to provide support to the Multnomah County Emergency Operations Center.
- >County Facilities has identified hand sanitizer plans for the majority of County buildings. Janitorial staff is prepared for enhanced cleaning efforts as soon as needed.
- CDC Posters are en route and will be posted in all County-occupied buildings to help reinforce the benefits of hand washing and other virus prevention messages.

Emergency Support Function 8: Health & Medical

- This is a dynamic situation. Information and case counts are changing rapidly and the incident is on-going.
- >CDC testing criteria for COVID-19 has changed. The Oregon Health Authority is actively working on updating Oregon's testing criteria and new guidance will be provided by the Tri-County Health Officer.

➤ CITY OF PORTLAND

- The Portland Bureau of Emergency Management (PBEM) will maintain close coordination with Multnomah County EOC via an agency representative and other methods. Today, the City of Portland is sending all employees communications and an FAQ regarding sick leave and teleworking policies. PBEM is working on Continuity of Operations Planning (COOP) guidance to all bureaus to help them prepare. The City will begin publishing Situation Status Reports in the near future, mostly focused on COOP activities, which will be kept internally. The City is also contributing to the County's homeless response plan.

➤ WASHINGTON COUNTY

- The Washington County Board of County Commissioners has adopted a declaration of emergency.

- ➤ Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA)
 - The FEMA National Business Emergency Operations Center (NBEOC) has activated as part of the Interagency Crisis Action Task Force, supporting the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS), the Lead Federal Agency for our nation's response to COVID-19. FEMA requests that private sector partners use the [NBEOC Operations Dashboard](#) for current situational information, provide questions or input through the chat feature, and participate on the daily calls. The first call is tomorrow, March 5 at 1200 PST/1500 EDT.
- ➤ Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC)
 - The CDC has released [Guidance for Businesses and Employers to Plan and Respond to COVID-19](#). The guidance includes recommended strategies for employers to use now, planning considerations, and recommendations for an outbreak response plan.
