

BEFORE THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS  
FOR MULTNOMAH COUNTY, OREGON  
ORDINANCE NO. 739

An ordinance to amend MCC 2.30.300 to eliminate the Justice Coordinating Council.

(Language in brackets [ ] is to be deleted; underlined language is new)

Multnomah County ordains as follow:

SECTION I. FINDINGS.

A. On December 12, 1991, the Board of County Commissioners adopted Ordinance No. 707 changing the function of the Justice Coordinating Council and adjusting the number and qualifications of its members.

B. Subsequent to the adoption of Ordinance 707, a new group, the Public Safety Council (hereinafter the "Council"), has come into existence.

C. The Public Safety Council is comprised of the same membership as the Justice Coordinating Council except that it includes representatives from the Cities of Wood Village, Fairview, Troutdale, and Maywood Park.

D. Representatives from all of the public bodies concerned have met and developed a "statement of the mission, organizational structure, and principles of collaboration of the Public Safety


Council, which outlines its structure and purpose.

E. The Board of County Commissioners has resolved to participate in the Public Safety Council. Therefore, the Justice Coordinating Council should be abolished.

SECTION II. AMENDMENT OF MCC 2.30.300. MCC 2.30.300 (1) is repealed.
