General Information

1. What action are you requesting from the Board?

Provide briefing to Board of County Commissioners on the Solid Waste Regulatory System Report and next steps.

During FY13, the Sustainability Office with the help of a consultant, conducted research to understand the current solid waste activity in unincorporated Multnomah County. The research was to help determine an effective and efficient solid waste regulatory framework for unincorporated areas of the County. The report is Attachment A.

Multnomah County is required to implement a solid waste and recycling program in the unincorporated areas of the County in compliance with State law and in accordance with Metro's Regional Solid Waste Management Plan (RSWMP). The RSWMP sets residential service standards and a business recycling requirement. These requirements include monitoring haulers to ensure a minimum service level is provided and development and implementation of outreach methods and materials.

3. Explain the fiscal impact (current year and ongoing).

It is anticipated that a program will require approximately .25 FTE to implement.

4. Explain any legal and/or policy issues involved.

Multnomah County is required by State law to implement a solid waste and recycling program in the unincorporated areas of the County. The program may not conflict with Metro's program.

5. Explain any citizen and/or other government participation that has or will take place.

Multnomah County conferred with citizen groups in affected areas and has also met with affected haulers. Continued community participation will be central to the development of policy and code.
