# Progress on FY 15 Grant Development Recommendations

Recommendation	Status
Create standing cross-departmental grant committee	✓
Complete tracking and reporting gap analysis	On-going
Research and recommend countywide mechanism for tracking and reporting	In Process
Ensure access to grant writing resources	On-going
Increase grant literacy for county staff	On-going
Develop dashboard to track grant metrics	In Process



# FY 15 Successes

Launched cross-departmental collaboration with representation from every department/office

Established countywide structure and commitment to align the grant development ecosystem

Established shared definitions and criteria for grant development and tracking

Developed initial work plan for program and administrative workgroups

Secured \$29,907,160 in competitive grants to expand prioritized services and projects



# Countywide Grant Workgroups

## Purpose

Maintain and expand grant resources that support the county's mission by identifying and aligning effective practices across grant development, tracking, monitoring, compliance, and reporting efforts.



# Grant Development Workgroup

- Identify efficiencies and share best practices
- Facilitate cross-departmental coordination
- Identify collaborative grant opportunities
- Align efforts and communications with community partners
- Track cross-departmental and community partner collaboration

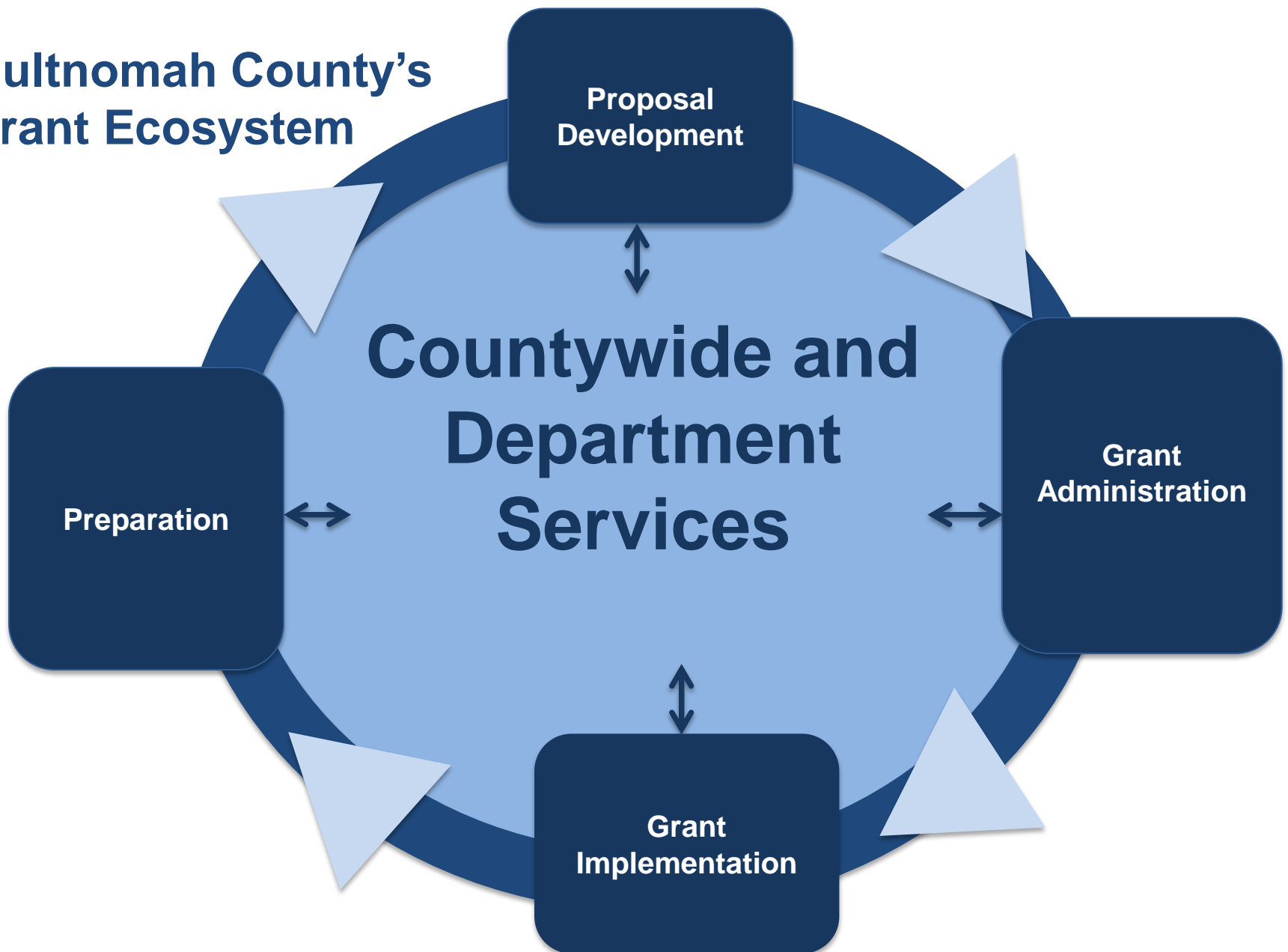


# Fiscal/Administrative Workgroup

- Work towards countywide grant management policy.

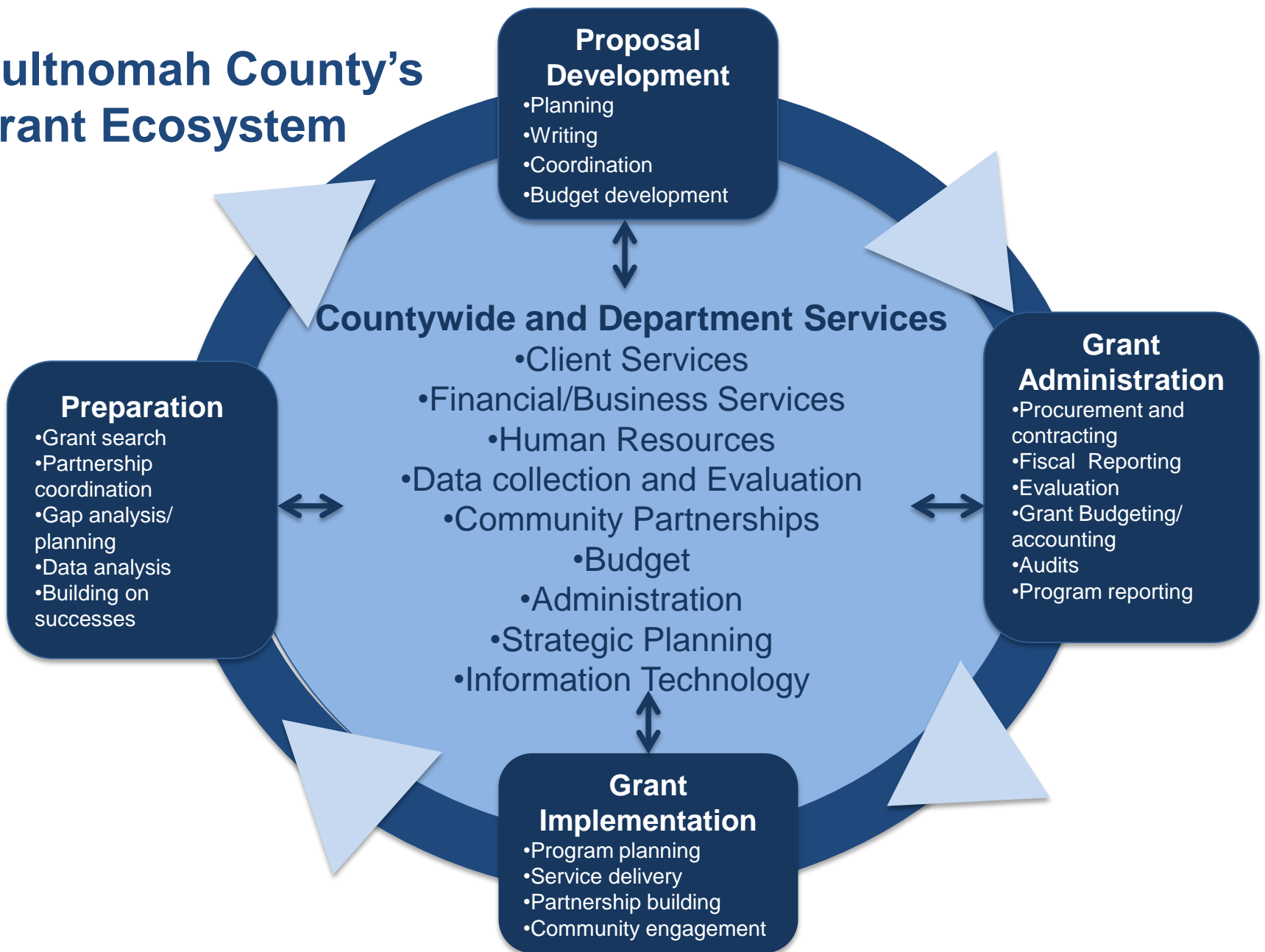


# Multnomah County's Grant Ecosystem

# Grants in Multnomah County

## Involving all parts of the ecosystem

- Competitive Grants (require an NOI)
- Renewal/continuation (covered by an existing NOI)
- Formula grants that require an application process

## Utilizing only 'Administration' functions in ecosystem

- Formula funding that comes to department as a strict pass-through
- Subcontracts
- Intergovernmental Agreements (IGA)
- Fee for Service
- Medicaid/Medicare
- State Formula Funds
- Other

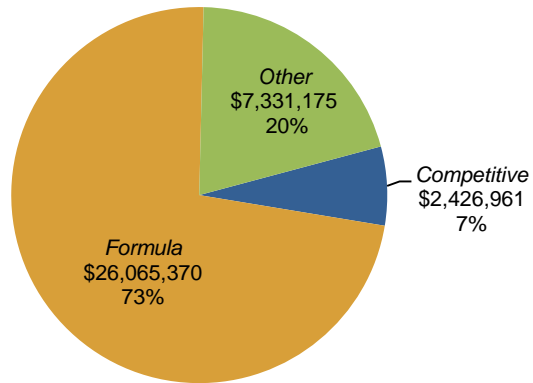

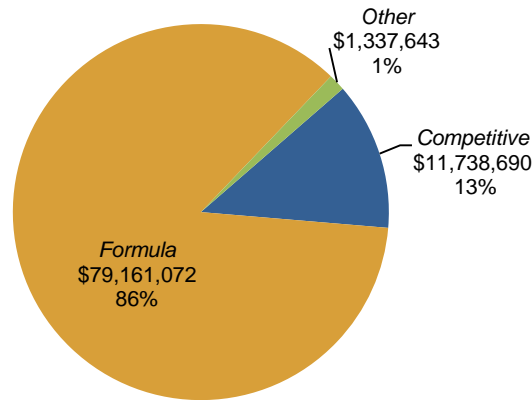
# Back-end Grant Funding by Department

## FY 16 Adopted Budget

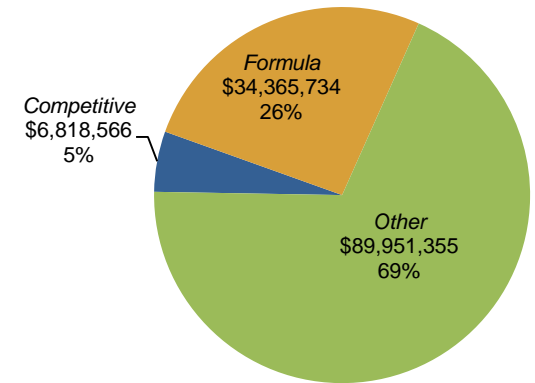
**DCJ : \$35,823,506**



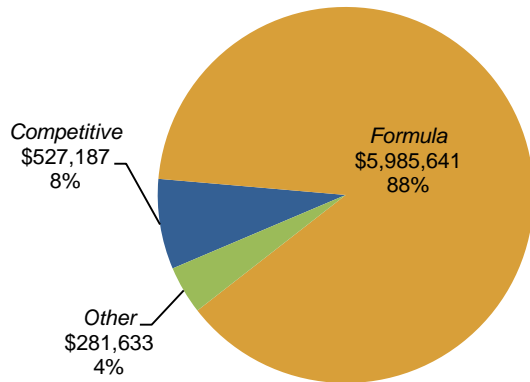
**DCHS : \$92,237,405**



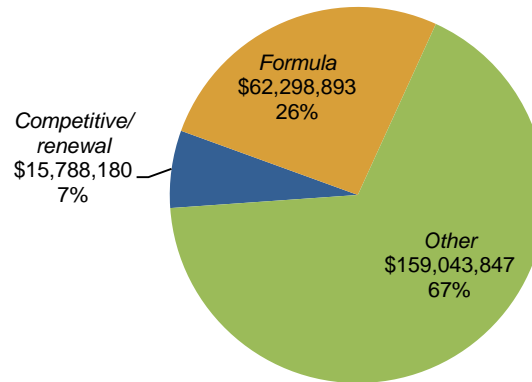

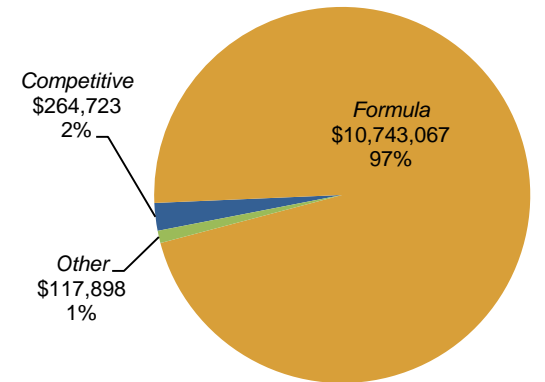

# **Focus on FY 16 Competitive Grants Opportunities**

- Implement innovative approaches to address strategic priorities
- Expand/enhance existing services
- Position county for additional funding opportunities
- Support existing infrastructure



# **Focus on FY 16 Competitive Grants Constraints**

- Limited ability to predict funding opportunities and/or eligibility
- Unstable federal and state funding streams
- Short grant turn-around requires up-front planning and nimble response teams
- Opportunities may not make sense from a Cost/Benefit perspective



# FY 16 Grant Priorities

- Infrastructure
- Equity
- Prevention/early intervention
- Housing/wrap-around supports
- Public Safety
- Program enhancements/expansion
