Program Offer 10029 – SummerWorks Internship Program outlines the paid summer internship program that supports key interventions to prevent student dropouts by connecting youth to career pathways. Commissioner Smith partnered with Worksystems, Inc. to bring the program to Multnomah County in Fiscal Year 2012 with 25 interns. In Fiscal Year 2013, the program was doubled to 50 interns with youth serving in various County departments, community organizations and small businesses. In Fiscal Year 2014, the program was again doubled, providing opportunities to 100 interns.
