Approve a proclamation proclaiming the week of May 6-12, National Nurses Week in Multnomah County, Oregon.

- All nurses have a critical responsibility to uphold the highest level of quality and ethical standards in their practice to ensure the delivery of superior health care to patients, families and society.
- Ethics is an essential component of everyday nursing practice across all specialties and settings and is inextricably linked to quality care.
- The revised [Code of Ethics for Nurses with Interpretive Statements](#) was released in 2015 - the first update since 2001. The revision ensures that the Code applies to modern clinical practice and advances in quality, and keeps pace with transformations in health care.
- Throughout the year, educational activities and events focused on ethics are planned, including webinars, a resource-rich website and a symposium.
- The *Code of Ethics* serves as a guide for carrying out nursing responsibilities in a manner consistent with quality nursing care and the ethical obligations of the profession.

- The new [*Blueprint for 21st Century Nursing Ethics: Report of the National Nursing Summit*](#) constitutes a plan for individuals and organizations to implement to improve 12 work environments, health care quality and health outcomes.
