General Information

1. What action are you requesting from the Board?

Approving an Ordinance Amending Multnomah County Code Chapter 21 – Health to add §21.450 to §21.458 – Air Quality Regulation and Declaring an Emergency.

2. Please provide sufficient background information for the Board and the public to understand this issue. Please note which Program Offer(s) this action affects and how it impacts the results.

The proposed ordinance would regulate the usage of wood-burning devices and recreational burning on certain days between October 1 to March 1 when air quality reaches unsafe levels. The ordinance would exempt low income households and those whose sole source of heat is wood stoves. It would also exempt burning during emergency conditions, when other sources of heat are not functioning. The program would be complaint-driven and persons subject to the ordinance would receive two warnings before being subject to civil penalties or restrictions.
