PROCLAMATION  
# 89-103

WHEREAS, fear and misunderstanding of Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome (AIDS) has lead to discrimination against people with AIDS, people who test positive for the HIV virus, people who are diagnosed as having HIV disease and people who are "perceived as having AIDS," and;

WHEREAS, the majority of Oregonians with AIDS reside in Multnomah County, and;


WHEREAS, federal and state laws prohibit discrimination because of AIDS, and;


WHEREAS, many Oregonians benefit from the protection these laws afford them, and;

WHEREAS, discrimination in the workplace is disruptive to people with AIDS and co-workers,


