### 1. What action are you requesting from the Board?

Reappointment of Sherry Willmschen and Pauline Duffy to the Non Departmental CBAC, Terry Shlaes to the Department of Community Services CBAC, David Torrey and Scott Eisenfeldt to the Department of County Assets CBAC. These 2<sup>nd</sup> term appointments will end June 30, 2016.

Appointment of Teresa Walton and Liza Morehead to the Department of Community Justice CBAC, Mary Stewart and Laura Chenet Leonard to the Non Departmental CBAC; Scott Kuyper, Donna Morris, and Joe Daunt to the Department of Community Services CBAC, Ben Brady, Robert Stabbert, Jeannine DeFuyter and Garry Diehl to the Department of County Management CBAC, Charles Wilhoite to the District Attorney's CBAC. These first term appointments will end June 30, 2016.

Citizen Budget Advisory Committees review the county budget in detail. They advise county departments, the Board of County Commissioners, other elected officials on policy, priorities and budget. CBAC nominees are passed forward by the Citizen Involvement Committee and appointed to 3-year terms by the Board of County Commissioners. Citizen Budget Advisory Committee members have a 2-term limit. These candidates meet the appointment criteria set forth by the CIC for membership on CBACs. They have

successfully participated in CBAC meetings, discussions, trainings, and field trips. The first term appointments will fill vacancies due to term limits. The 2<sup>nd</sup> term appointees are eager to continue serving on their particular CBAC.

This nomination process is consistent with the charter provisions establishing the CIC.

Acting as an independent advocate, evaluator and monitor of county citizen involvement, the CIC and its office work to enhance opportunities for citizen participation in policy and decision-making within Multnomah County, thereby increasing the openness of county government.

The Office of Citizen Involvement staff actively recruits new members of the CBACs with press releases, outreach to East County cities, Sauvie Island/Corbett Springdale residents, community groups, through social technology such as facebook, blogs, list-serves as well as word of mouth and various meetings and events. Application materials and recruitment announcements are placed on the County Website. Current members of the CIC recommend these nominees to the Board of County Commissioners for appointment.
