Legalizing a Portion of Historic Columbia River Highway, as County Road No. 917.

**The Multnomah County Board of Commissioners Finds:**

- a. Through omission or defect, doubt exists as to the legal establishment or the evidence of the establishment of a small portion of Historic Columbia River Highway, County Road No. 917, at the location of its intersection with Jackson Park Road, in the City of Troutdale, Multnomah County, Oregon, as more particularly described in the attached Exhibit A, (“the Road”).
- b. The Road as traveled and used for more than 25 years does not conform to the location of a road described in the County’s records.
- d. On January 28, 2016, by the adoption of Resolution No. 2016-004, this Board initiated proceedings for legalizing the Road, and directed the County Engineer to prepare a report, and directed the County Surveyor to conduct a survey of the Road.
- e. On February 19, 2016, the written report of the County Engineer was filed with the Clerk of the Board recommending legalization of the Road, and which included the survey prepared by the County Surveyor as required under ORS 368.206 (1).
- f. County Transportation has provided notice of this April 7, 2016 proceeding in compliance with ORS 368.206 (1)(c).
- g. After considering all the matters presented herein, this Board has determined that the legalization of the Road is in the public interest.

**The Multnomah County Board of Commissioners Orders:**

1. As authorized under ORS 368.201 to 368.221, that the portion of Historic Columbia River Highway, County Road No. 917, located in the City of Troutdale, Multnomah County, Oregon as more particularly described and shown in the attached Exhibit A (“the Road”), is hereby legalized as a county road, to be included henceforth as a portion of County Road No. 917.
2. Except as described and shown in Exhibit A, County Road No. 917 is not altered nor otherwise impacted in anyway by this Order.
3. Further, as provided at ORS 368.216 (2), the County Surveyor and County Transportation staff shall comply with all of the requirements of ORS 368.106 (1)-(4), to perfect the legalization of the Road.

4. Upon the completion of the legalization procedures required under ORS 368.201 to 368.221; any records showing the location of the Road that conflict with the location of the Road as described in this Order are void, and the Road exists as described and shown on this Order.
