



Definitions of Poverty



Types of Poverty

LONG-TERM POVERTY

Persistent and ongoing poverty affecting seniors, persons with disabilities, and other populations whose options for exiting poverty are limited

SITUATIONAL POVERTY

Temporary or episodic poverty caused by a sudden or unexpected personal or economic crisis


ECONOMIC POVERTY

Persistent economic instability affecting people whose wages and benefits are not sufficient to meet their household's basic needs

SOCIAL POVERTY


Occurs when individual, societal or institutional barriers prevent people from accessing economic opportunities or fully participating in society









% of Total Population that is Populations of Color



% of Population in Poverty that is Populations of Color




Poverty in Multnomah County's Communities of Color is Growing





Percentage of Each Household Type in Poverty




% of Total Population that is under Age 18




% of Population in Poverty that is under Age 18




Persons with Disabilities




% of Persons with Disabilities in Poverty




The Geography of Poverty in Multnomah County

% Households Below 100% Federal Poverty Level

















