Declaring January 2014 as National Slavery and Human Trafficking Prevention Month in Multnomah County, Oregon.

The Multnomah County Board of Commissioners Finds:


- a. Today in the United States, it is estimated that as many as 300,000 minors are at risk for being trafficked for sexual exploitation. A recent Portland State University study identified 469 unduplicated victims in the Portland area alone.
- b. This study found that 15.5 was the average age at which victims were first referred to DHS or the Sexual Assault Resource Center.
- c. Human trafficking is modern day slavery, and an effective community response must include comprehensive services for victims, and a coordinated effort by law enforcement to punish the traffickers and other exploiters who drive this criminal industry.
- d. There will be community events culminating in the annual celebration of National Freedom Day on February 1, 2013.

The Multnomah County Board of Commissioners Proclaims:


