Building Reproductive Autonomy and Voices for Equity (BRAVE) coalition leaders have met with County commissioners in recent months regarding issues concerning reproductive health access for, primarily, adolescent, minority, LGBTQ, and immigrant/refugee communities. The purpose of this board briefing is to discuss these issues generally with members of the BRAVE coalition.

Multnomah County’s Public Health department will provide information pertaining to: data on key aspects of reproductive health; the LGBTQ data equity project; the HIV/STD/Adolescent health program; and the Maternal, Child, and Family Health program, as context for County support for community-led health equity efforts. BRAVE coalition members will discuss their work in advancing and highlighting reproductive health and access for women, people of color, and LGBT people.

The BRAVE project and coalition was started out of Western States Center in 2013. It has evolved and now involves many leaders of color along with partner organizations, including the Asian Pacific American Network of Oregon (APANO); International Center for Traditional Childbearing; Momentum Alliance; Mano a Mano; Oregon Latino Health Coalition; and Pinos y Campesinos Unidos del Noroeste (PCUN). Individual participants include community health workers, organizers, directors and staff from various organizations, professors, students, and faith leaders.
