A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FAIRVIEW, OREGON, REQUESTING THE MULTNOMAH COUNTY BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, MULTNOMAH COUNTY, OREGON, TO EXTEND THE PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD ON THE PROPOSED 2010-2014 TRANSPORTATION CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PLAN AND PROGRAM.

WHEREAS, the City of Fairview received notice of the Multnomah County draft 2010-2014 Transportation Capital Improvement Plan and Program (CIPP) on January 7, 2010; and

WHEREAS, the CIPP calls for public involvement and input from affected cities to inform policy choices and investments in the transportation system; and

WHEREAS, the advertised period in which interested parties may comment on the draft CIPP closes on February 8, 2010; and

WHEREAS, a hearing of the Multnomah County Board of County Commissioners is tentatively scheduled for consideration of the draft CIPP on February 11, 2010; and

WHEREAS, improvement of roadways under the jurisdiction of Multnomah County located within the City of Fairview are essential to the future economic development and vitality of businesses located in the City of Fairview; and

WHEREAS, neither the Fairview City Council, its Planning Commission, staff, citizens, nor its commercial and industrial businesses and were consulted about transportation needs and priorities prior to the January 7, 2010, release of the draft CIPP; and

WHEREAS, the Columbia Cascade River District Steering Committee, which includes elected and appointed representatives of Multnomah County, the Cities of Fairview, Troutdale, Wood Village, Gresham, and representatives of the Port of Portland, the West Columbia Gorge Chamber of Commerce has raised concerns about the proposed CIPP; and

WHEREAS, the City of Fairview believes that key economic development and road safety projects such as Sandy Boulevard east of 223rd Avenue, the north railroad overpass on 223rd Avenue, and 223rd Avenue between Halsey and Sandy warrant further consideration before action is taken on the draft CIPP; and


WHEREAS, the City of Fairview needs additional time to consult with area businesses and industries to identify transportation needs and priorities in the City of Fairview for the area's continued industrial, economic, and community development; and

WHEREAS, on February 1, 2010, the East Multnomah County Transportation Committee agreed to the City of Fairview's request for an extension of the public comment period on the draft CIPP to March 8, 2010.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FAIRVIEW AS FOLLOWS:


