### General Information

**1. What action are you requesting from the Board?**

Appoint new members to the Multnomah County Business Advisory Council to fill vacant seats and reappoint members whose terms have expired.

**2. Please provide sufficient background information for the Board and the public to understand this issue. Please note which Program Offer this action affects and how it impacts the results.**

Ordinance 1183 created the Multnomah County Business Advisory Council ("BAC") to help improve the local business climate by establishing a forum for improving communication between the business community and county government while working to help make Multnomah County an even better place to do business. The BAC is comprised of volunteer members who live or work within Multnomah County and who possess expertise in areas of economic development, entrepreneurship, and social equity. The BAC directly supports the work of Program Offer 10035A (Economic Development).

Members of the BAC are appointed to terms up to two years in length, with no more than half of the terms set to expire in any given year to reduce the turnover on the BAC in any given year. Because the BAC was created in June 2011, half of the initial members were appointed to terms of one year. This resolution reappoints members to two year terms who have completed their initial partial one-year term and wish to continue to serve on the BAC, and this resolution appoints new members to fill vacant seats on the BAC.
