## General Information:

### 1. What action are you requesting from the Board?

- The Multnomah County Sheriff's Office respectfully requests time to brief the Board of Commissioners on pending revisions to the Jail Capacity Management Plan.

### 2. Please provide sufficient background information for the Board and the public to understand this issue. Please note which Program Offer(s) this action affects and how it impacts the results.

- The Multnomah County Sheriff's Office will be respectfully requesting the Board of Commissioners to approve a revised Resolution and Jail Capacity Management Plan, at a regular Board Meeting in November. Multnomah County's current Jail Capacity Management Plan, was created by a committee of criminal justice stakeholders and was last approved in July 2017. The Plan states that upon issuing a red alert/emergency population notice, MCSO develops a prioritized list of adults in custody based on criteria outlined within the Plan. A score is assigned to each criteria, which determines who will be forced released out of jail. The purpose of this Board Briefing is for the Sheriff's Office to provide an overview of recommended edits and to answer questions about prior forced releases and jail population trends.

- The Jail Capacity Management Plan reflects existing budget allocations.

**4. Explain any legal and/or policy issues involved.**

- The Jail Capacity Management Plan is enacted in accordance with ORS § 169.042-046.
