ORDINANCE NO. 432

An Ordinance establishing the Multnomah County Task Force on Blue Lake Park.

Multnomah County ordains as follows:

SECTION 1. FINDINGS

The Board of County Commissioners finds that there is a need to:

A. Identify in a Master Plan the options available to develop the Park;

B. Develop and utilize Blue Lake Park to its full potential as a recreational area;

C. Provide for citizen participation in the development of the Master Plan;

D. Provide a foundation for a significant contribution to the economic growth of mid-Multnomah County through development of a recreational, educational, and cultural complex that will appeal to tourists passing through the area;

E. Provide direction for the rehabilitation, enhancement and expansion of existing active and passive recreational opportunities;

F. Identify opportunities for the enhancement of fish and wildlife resources;

G. Secure an established, ongoing revenue base to develop and maintain the park in accordance with the Master Plan.

SECTION 2. PURPOSE

There is hereby established a Multnomah County Task Force on Blue Lake Park which shall assist the Parks Division in preparation of the study work plan; assist in selection of a Master Plan consultant; assist the Parks Division with review of work of the consultant in progress; conduct public discussions on plan proposals; and work and receive recommendations from the consultant and Parks Division in the preparation of and presentation to the Board of County Commissioners

of a proposed Park Master Plan.

The Task Force shall also work with and receive recommendations from an archaeological panel established by Blue Lake Park Archaeological Survey and Planning Grant dated April, 1984. The Task Force shall act as the Master Plan Advisory Committee as required by the Blue Lake Archaeological and Planning Grant application dated April, 1984.

SECTION 3. MEMBERS

The Task Force shall be composed of thirteen (13) members appointed by the County Executive with the approval of the Board of County Commissioners to be appointed on, or about October 17, 1984. The membership of the Task Force shall be as follows:

- A. A representative of the Portland Area Recreation Coalition;
- B. A representative of the City of Gresham Parks Department;
- C. A representative of the Oregon Parks Foundation;
- D. A representative of the Interlachen Association;
- E. A representative of the Troutdale Historical Society;
- F. A representative of the Gresham Chamber of Commerce;
- G. A representative of the Portland Chamber of Commerce;
- H. A member of the financial community with knowledge of private and public financing;
- I. A representative of the East County Youth Services Center;
- J. A representative of the East County Coordinating Committee;
- K. A representative of the Mt. Hood Community College Activities Program;
- L. A member of the City of Portland Parks Department;

M. A member of the Greater Portland Convention and Visitors Association.

SECTION 4. TERM

Each member shall serve until the final recommendations are given to the Board of County Commissioners.

SECTION 5. VACANCIES

A vacancy on the Task Force shall be filled by appointment of the County Executive, and with approval of the Board.

SECTION 6. COMPENSATION

Members shall receive no compensation for serving on the Task Force.

SECTION 7. DUTIES

The Task Force shall participate in the review of available options for development of Blue Lake Park, assist the Parks Division in the review of the consultants work, and report findings in a proposed Park Master Plan to the Board of County Commissioners and the County Executive on or about June 1, 1985.

The proposed Park Master Plan shall include recommendations concerning the following matters:

A. Development of recreational alternatives for Blue Lake Park, including an aquatics center.

B. Methods of funding, both public and private, for the development and operation of Blue Lake Park.

C. Whether the Task Force should continue to serve as an advisory commission in implementing the Master Plan.

SECTION 8. CONFLICT OF INTEREST

Any member of the Task Force who has monetary or investment interest in any matter before the Task Force shall so inform the Task Force and refrain from voting on the matter. However, the interested member may participate in any discussion by the Task Force of such matter.

SECTION 9. ADOPTION

This Ordinance, being necessary for the health, safety and general welfare of the people of Multnomah County, shall take effect on the thirtieth day after its adoption pursuant to Section 5.50 of the Charter of Multnomah County.

ADOPTED this 20th day of September, 1984, upon passage following its second reading.
