PROCLAMATION NO. 00-054

Proclaiming April 28, 2000 as "WORKERS MEMORIAL DAY" in Multnomah County, Oregon

The Multnomah County Board of County Commissioners Finds:

- a. Every year more than 10,000 American workers are killed on the job, tens of thousands are permanently disabled, and millions are injured.
- b. Another 100,000 workers die from cancer, lung disease, and other diseases related to toxic chemical exposure at work.
- c. Concerned Americans are determined to prevent these tragedies by:
 - ✓ Organizing Workers Memorial Day on April 28, a day chosen by the unions of the AFL-CIO as a day to remember the victims of workplace injuries and disease;
 - ✓ Renewing efforts to seek stronger safety and health protections, better standards and enforcement, and fair and just compensation;
 - ✓ Rededicating themselves to improving safety and health in every American workplace.


The Multnomah County Board of County Commissioners Proclaims:
