General Information

1. What action are you requesting from the Board?

Adopt amendments to an Intergovernmental Agreement between Multnomah County and the City of Gresham providing the City the authority to provide building permit services for select unincorporated properties in eastern Multnomah County. The requested action involves adoption of materials in Exhibits 1, 1a and 1b.

2. Please provide sufficient background information for the Board and the public to understand this issue. Please note which Program Offer this action affects and how it impacts the results.

In 1986, the City of Gresham and Multnomah County entered into an Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) recognizing that the most cost effective and rational method for delivery of building permit issuance and related services is through the City rather than the County. The unincorporated lands subject to the 1986 IGA are illustrated in Exhibit 1a. In 1990, the 1986 IGA was amended to clarify boundary issues, enforcement matters and imposition and collection of fees.

The City of Gresham desires to transfer building permit authority to the City of Troutdale for five properties illustrated in Exhibit 1b located near the intersection of Troutdale and Sweetbriar Roads.

Transferring building permit authority for the five properties as described requires that the IGA permit service area map be amended. Additionally, text within the IGA has been updated to reflect current Oregon code terminology and to more accurately reflect current building permit service functions.

3. Explain the fiscal impact (current year and ongoing).

NA. All revenue derived from building service and permit fees within the permit service area currently accrue, and will continue to accrue, to the City of Gresham.

4. Explain any legal and/or policy issues involved.

The County attorney's office was involved in the drafting of the amended IGA.

5. Explain any citizen and/or other government participation that has or will take place.

The IGA amendments were drafted in close coordination with staff from the City of Troutdale and City of Gresham.
