

**DUII Intensive Supervision Program**  
**DISP**  
Multnomah Circuit Court

**Mission**

Promote public safety by supervising high risk/high needs repeat DUII individual. Through intensive and collaborative supervision and effective treatment DISP strives to reduce recidivism, change lives, and increase public safety.

**Program Details**

DISP Court is a specialty court program founded in 1998 to address the issue of high risk, repeat DUII individuals. Individuals in the program are sentenced to statutory jail sentences and probation. The program's operations and policies are driven by evidence-based research, best practices for DWI/DUI specialty courts, and the Criminal Justice Commission's Specialty Court Standards. Prospective individuals are advised of the program requirements at a settlement conference prior to entry. Both hearings are informative and include a review of program and probation requirements, expectations, and an opportunity to address potential barriers to entry and participation.

**Services and Supports Provided**

All individuals in DISP have access to a multidisciplinary team at weekly court hearings. The team consists of the judge, coordinator, case manager, probation officer, defense attorney, prosecutor, culturally responsive treatment providers and peer mentors. Weekly case manager meetings include referrals for employment, education, job training, housing, legal issues, mental health services, no cost TriMet passes, peer mentor services, transportation planning and community support meetings as appropriate. Accountability and sobriety are monitored with electronic alcohol monitors, GPS and urinalysis testing for alcohol and drugs. The court uses incentives (verbal praise in court, tangible incentives, days off probation etc.) and sanctions (written assignments, community service, increased supervision, flash incarceration, GPS, etc.) to modify behavior. Felony cases receive 36 months supervised probation and misdemeanor cases receive 24 months' probation.

**Statistics**

- Over 2500 clients entered DISP since 1998; 75% have graduated the program
- Recidivism rates are for DUII are 5% within three years of sentencing and around 25% since 1998.
- All DISP clients received
  - Access to Alcohol and Drug treatment
  - A minimum of 90 days 24/7 electronic monitoring and random urinalysis testing
  - All DISP clients received case management services, monitoring, and supervision
