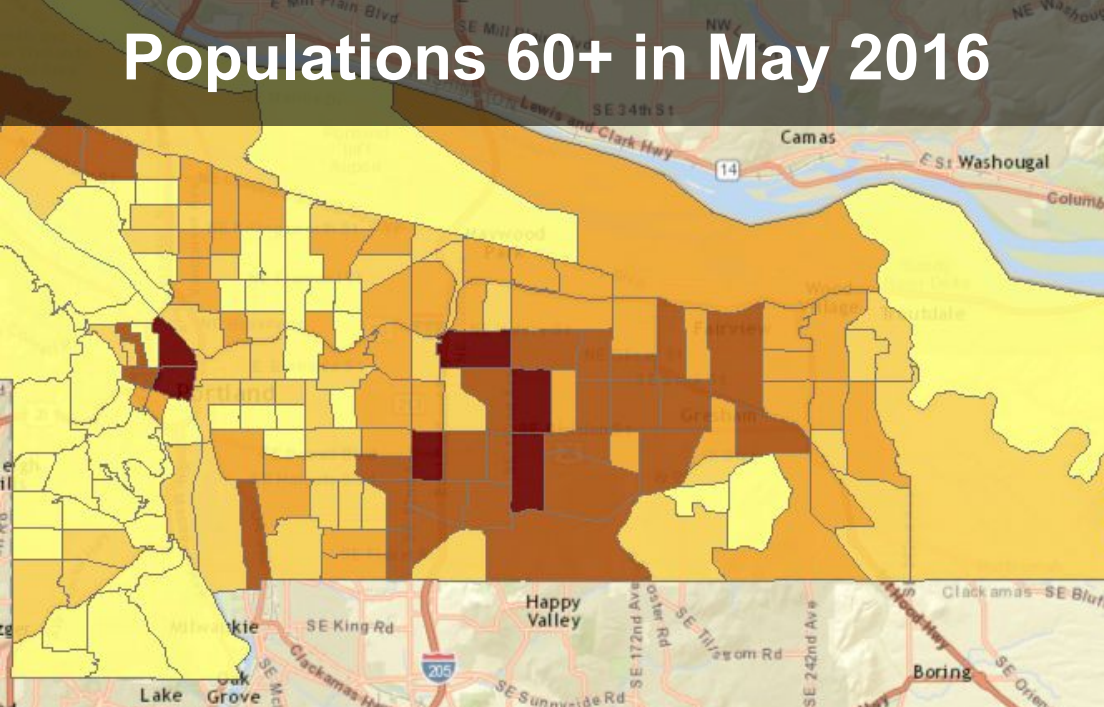

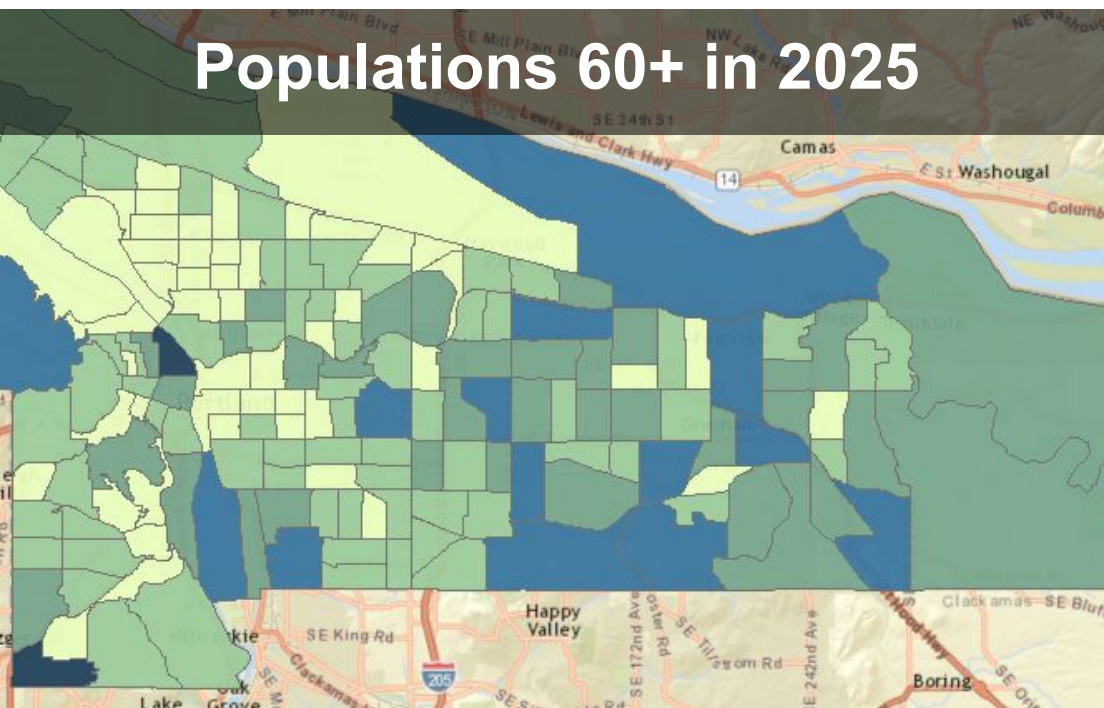
Populations 60+ in May 2016

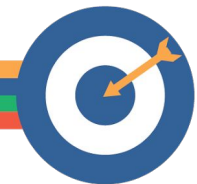

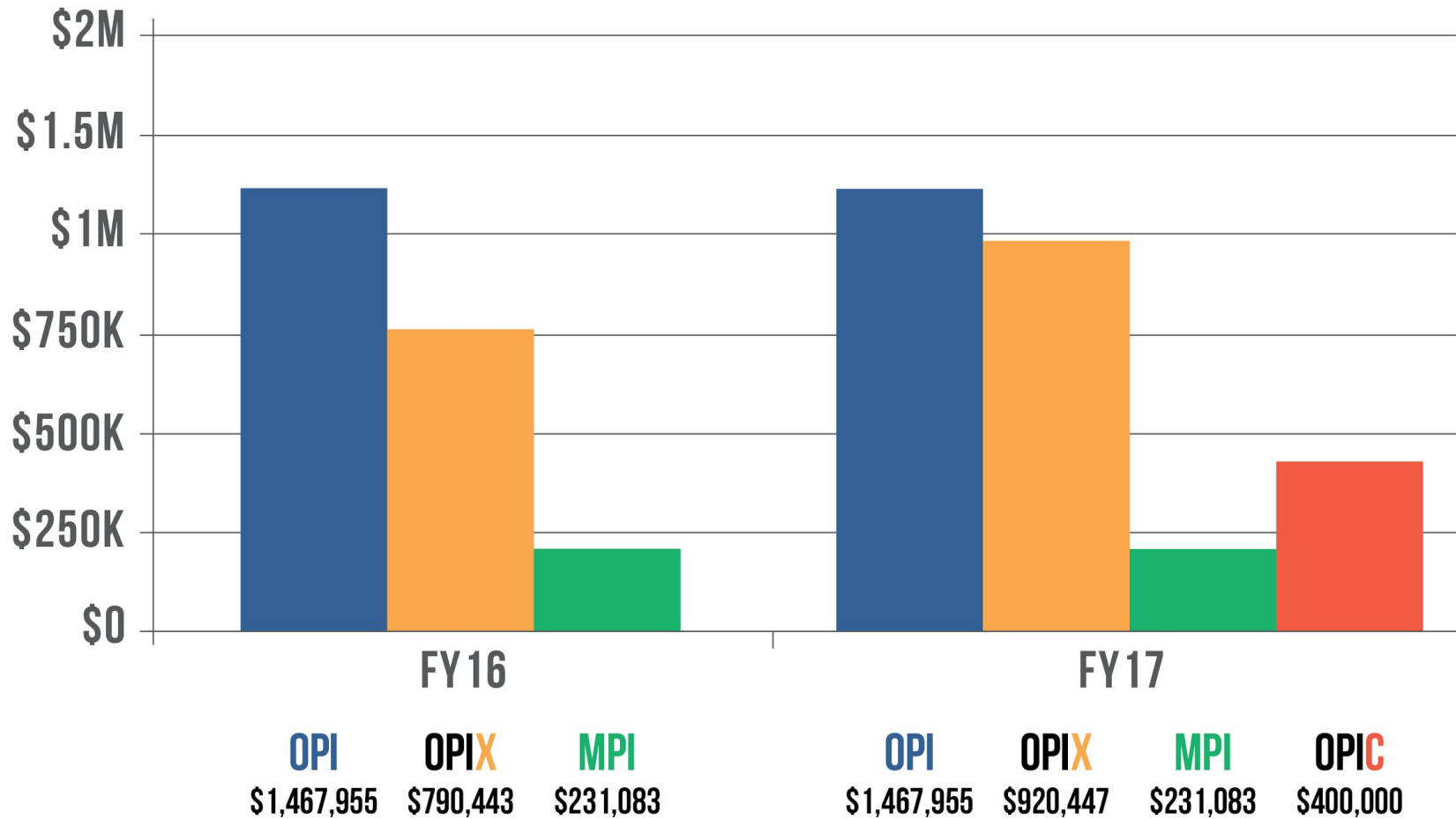

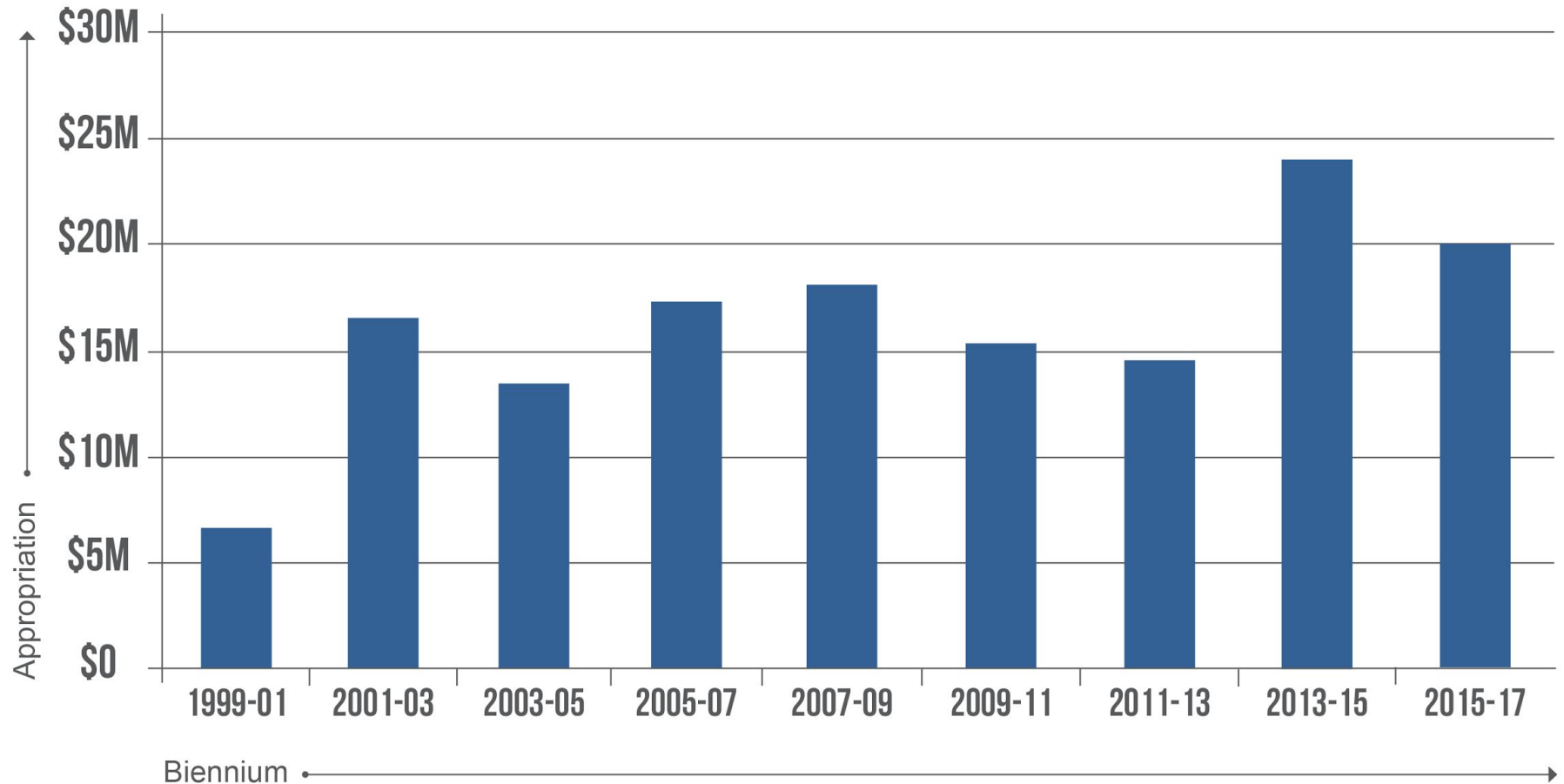

Funding for OPI in Multnomah County



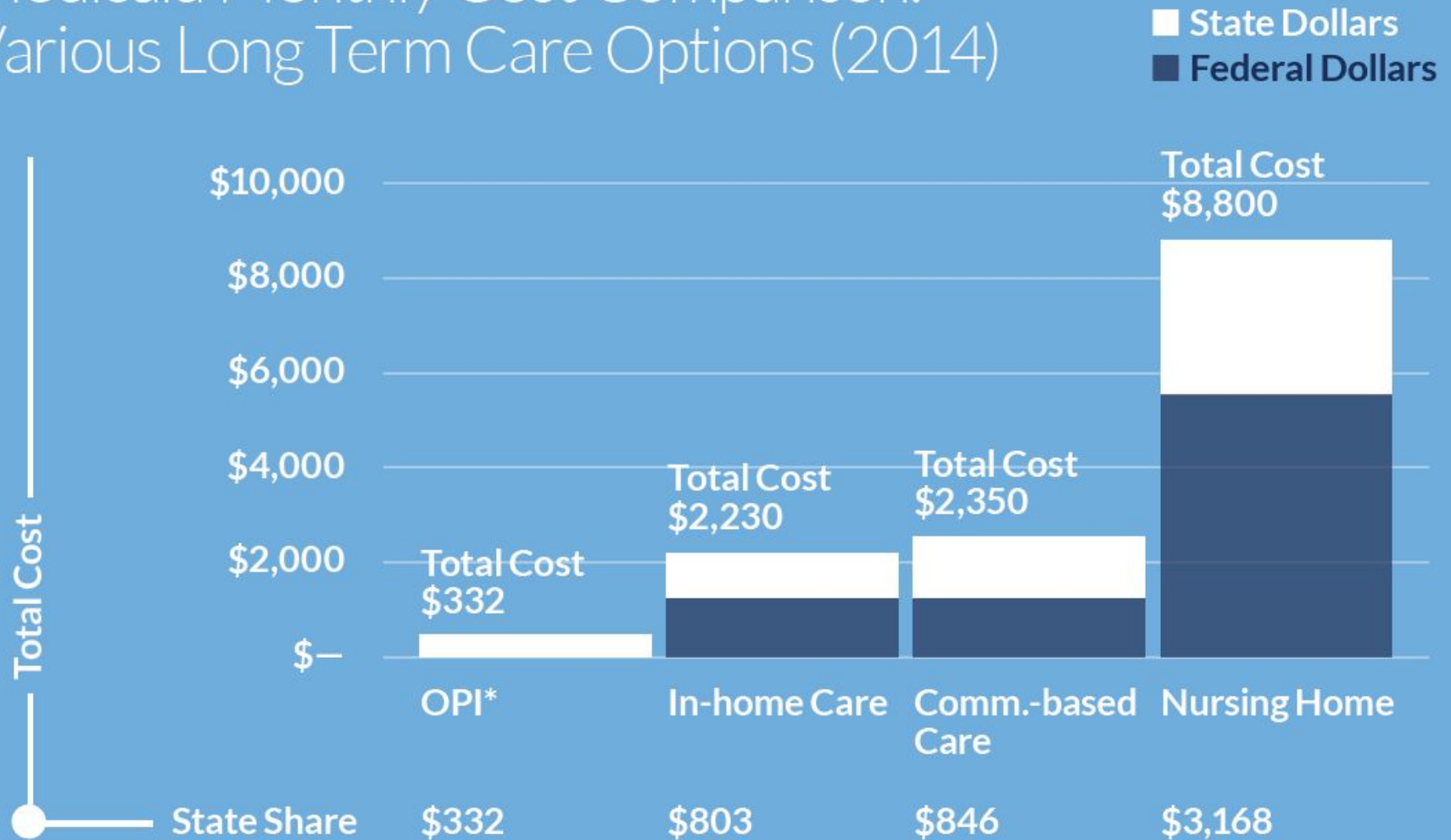
OPI Appropriation History

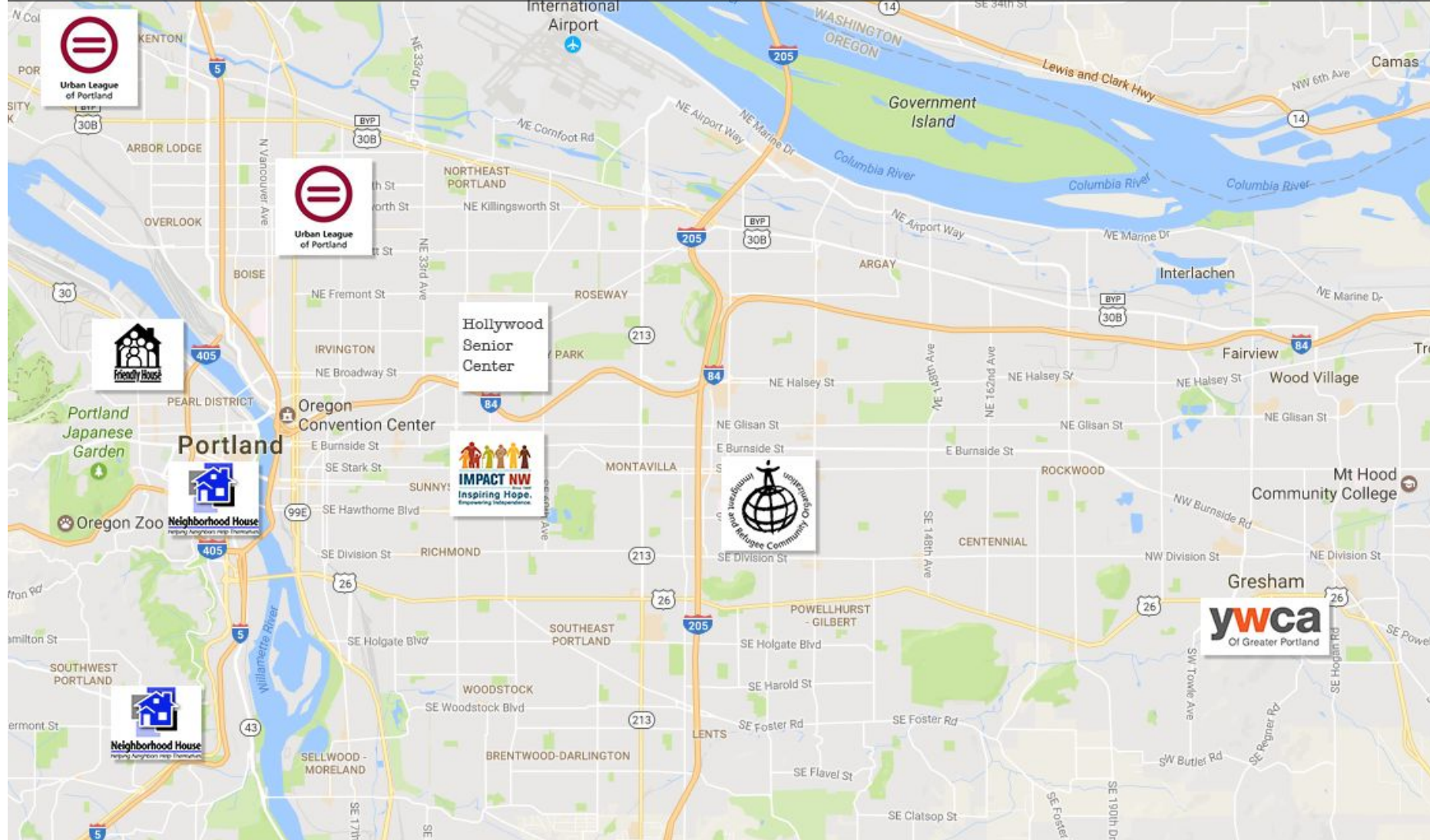


Because of County investments 150 + people were able to be taken off wait list and stay in their homes.
