NIJ is interested in supporting research in several key related to intimate partner violence. A key gap continues to be evaluating responses to intimate partner violence victims as they move through the criminal justice system, including dynamics of race, ethnicity, and socioeconomic status. NIJ is seeking research that assesses or evaluates the following responses to intimate partner violence victims in the criminal justice systems.

DCJ would develop an dynamic risk and needs tool for use with domestic violence offenders on supervision. It would provide the capability to sort DV offenders into different clinical groups, incorporate victim input and connect to case management targets.
