WHEREAS, Oregon Sentencing Guidelines become effective November 1, 1989 pursuant to Section 90, Chapter 790, Oregon Laws 1989; and

WHEREAS, rules of the Sentencing Guidelines Board as adopted pursuant to Chapter 619, Oregon Laws 1987 and Chapter 151, Oregon Laws 1989 requires the Board of County Commissioners to designate as supervisory authorities those state and local correctional officials in each county with responsibility for operating correctional supervision services and custodial facilities; and

WHEREAS, the County wishes to maintain maximum flexibility within its existing correctional resources to manage offenders consistent with their risk, behavior, or consistent with the capacity of the program or facility; and

WHEREAS, the designated supervisory authorities are required to keep records of all custody units (as defined by OAR 253-05-012) served by offenders as well as records of other activities relevant to the offenders correctional supervision status while under the jurisdiction of the supervisory authority in a form which will enable the court to determine whether an offender has complied with the conditions imposed as part of probation; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that Multnomah County designates as supervisory authorities the:

- a. Regional Manager, Department of Corrections, State Field Services, N. W. Region Portland Branch for felony probation and post-release supervision;
- b. Multnomah County Sheriff for correctional institutions (Multnomah County Detention Center, Multnomah County Correctional Facility, Multnomah County Inverness Jail, Multnomah County Courthouse Jail, Multnomah County Restitution Center) and sentenced inmate supervision programs;
- c. Director, department of Justice Services for other correctional programs, sanctions and services;
- d. Presiding Judge, Circuit Court of Oregon for bench probation (as defined by OAR 253-03-001); and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the supervisory authorities shall meet monthly to review the impact of sentencing guideline implementation and system capacity needs.
