General Information

1. What action are you requesting from the Board?

Adoption of an Ordinance that revises MCC Chapter 25.

2. Please provide sufficient background information for the Board and the public to understand this issue. Please note which Program Offer this action affects and how it impacts the results.

- a. State law provides that the "county governing body" has the authority to request that the Governor declare an emergency when local resources are not adequate to deal with an emergency. ORS 401.165(1). The Multnomah County Code needs to be updated to clarify that the Board intends to delegate this authority to the Chair.
- b. The County Code currently provides that the document declaring an emergency must include, among other things, a certification that "all local resources have been expended." However, under State law that condition does not need to exist before an emergency is declared by the County. Therefore, the paragraph requiring the certification should be removed from the Code.

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- c. State law provides that the "county governing body" may authorize an agency or official to order mandatory evacuations of residents and other individuals when doing so is necessary for public safety or necessary for the efficient conduct of activities that minimize or mitigate the effects of the emergency. The Multnomah County Code needs to be updated to clarify that the Board has delegated the authority to order mandatory evacuations to the Chair or the Chair's successor.


