Approving Request for Temporary Use Permit for a Portion of Multnomah County's Wapato Facility

The Multnomah County Board of Commissioners Finds:

- a. Multnomah County owns the Wapato Facility located at 14355 N. Bybee Lake Court, Portland, Oregon.
- b. Portland Police Bureau (PPB) has made a request for a five month use permit for a portion of the Wapato Facility for Tuesday and Wednesday classroom and tactical training.
- c. The County Facilities and Property management program (FPM) finds that the requested three (3) rooms to be used as classrooms and secured corridors and stairwells to be used for tactical training within a portion of the Wapato Facility is suitable for this use and is not needed for County use and thus surplus for the time frame of this permit.
- d. Under county Administrative procedure FAC-3, Section V, Board approval is necessary for any property use permits of County owned real property for which the term is longer than 90-days.
- e. A temporary permit has been negotiated with the City of Portland, on behalf of the PPB, the Permittee, for a term to commence January 7, 2014 through May 28, 2014; a copy of said permit is attached and identified as Exhibit 1.
- f. The public interest is best served by the approval of the short term use permit of the Wapato Facility.

The Multnomah County Board of Commissioners Resolves:

1. The Board approves the Permit, a copy of which is attached to this Resolution as Exhibit 1. The County Chair is authorized to execute the permit substantially in the form set forth in Exhibit 1.
2. The County Chair is further authorized to execute any amendments to the permit without further Board action.
