


Community Wellness and Prevention


- Institute nutrition policies in schools
- Policies encourage use of healthy, locally-sourced food, school gardens
- Children eat healthier and obesity rates decrease
- Children are resilient
- Communities are creating less carbon

Evaluation and Surveillance

Examples of data:

- % of food service ingredients at hospitals that are locally sourced
- # of Food and Vegetable vouchers used at Farmer's Markets
- # of Safe Routes to Schools programs implemented
- # of heat-related health messages disseminated and to whom






Public Health Assessment


Assess health outcomes and vulnerability

- Climate variables (e.g. temperature)
- Potential health impact indicators (e.g., emergency room visits related to heat and respiratory illness)
- Social groups at high risk of these health outcomes (e.g., children, elders, people of color)
- Environmental features that contribute to the health outcomes identified above (e.g., urban heat island effect and air pollution)

Non-White Population, 2008 Estimates




Median Household Income, 2008 Estimates

Using mapping to determine vulnerable populations and health impacts

Public Health Assessment

- List health interventions available for health outcomes
