WHEREAS the limited availability of public funds has an adverse effect on the operation of the Multnomah County Library; and,

WHEREAS the Multnomah Board of County Commissioners created by resolution the Library Entrepreneurial Initiative Team to develop ideas for alternative (non-tax) revenue sources for the Multnomah County Library; and,

WHEREAS the final report of the Library Entrepreneurial Initiatives Team recommended the development of a program of entrepreneurial activities; and,

WHEREAS a variety of specific entrepreneurial activities were identified in that report as a potentially significant source of non-tax revenue; and

WHEREAS the current design of the reconstruction of the Central Library may have an impact on some of those possible activities; and,

WHEREAS the design and construction of the Midland Library may have an impact on some of those possible activities; and,

WHEREAS the Board of County Commissioners created a Central Library Design and Construction Oversight Committee of review the design and reconstruction of the Central Library and will form a similar committee for the design and construction of the Midland Library.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the that the Director of Libraries, in conjunction with the Central Library Design and Construction Oversight Committee, ensure the design for the reconstruction of the Central Library accommodates possible future entrepreneurial activities including a coffee shop and/or gift shop; tasteful interior displays, whether for advertising or public display; facilities for specialized customer services such as photocopying, FAX, computer services, materials retrieval and delivery.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the design team for the Central Library reconstruction, and for the construction of the Midland Library, consult with a firm or firms experienced in interior environmental design and the delivery of similar services to determine appropriate design specifications.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that any design elements included for those purposes be compatible with the overall aesthetic design of the library.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that these issues be similarly addressed during the design and construction of other Multnomah County Library facilities in the future.
