Additionally, the Oregon Public Purchasing Association (OPPA) and the NIGP, along with other purchasing associations throughout the world, celebrate Purchasing Month by engaging in special efforts during the month of March to inform the public regarding the contributions of purchasing professionals in business, industry and government.
