

General Information

1. What action are you requesting from the Board?

The Tax Title Section is requesting the Board to approve the sale of Eleven Tax-Foreclosed Properties at public auction. The attached Exhibit A provides a map of each property. The Department of Community Services recommends that the public auction be approved.

2. Please provide sufficient background information for the Board and the public to understand this issue.

The Department, in order to assure the fiscal stability of the tax title fund, may identify properties to be sold at public auction and not available for donation to governments or non-profit housing sponsors, or open space preservation sponsors per Multnomah County Code Chapter 7.401(B).

3. Explain the fiscal impact (current year and ongoing).

The sale of these properties removes them from the County's ownership and maintenance requirements. The proceeds reimburse the County for any applicable Tax Title expenditures, reimburses any local municipalities for outstanding liens owing per the IGA and the remaining proceeds are distributed to the taxing districts.

4. Explain any legal and/or policy issues involved.

No legal issues are expected. The parcels will be sold "As Is" without guarantee of clear title.

5. Explain any citizen and/or other government participation that has or will take place.

Tax Title will send notification of the sale to all adjacent property owners prior to the sale.

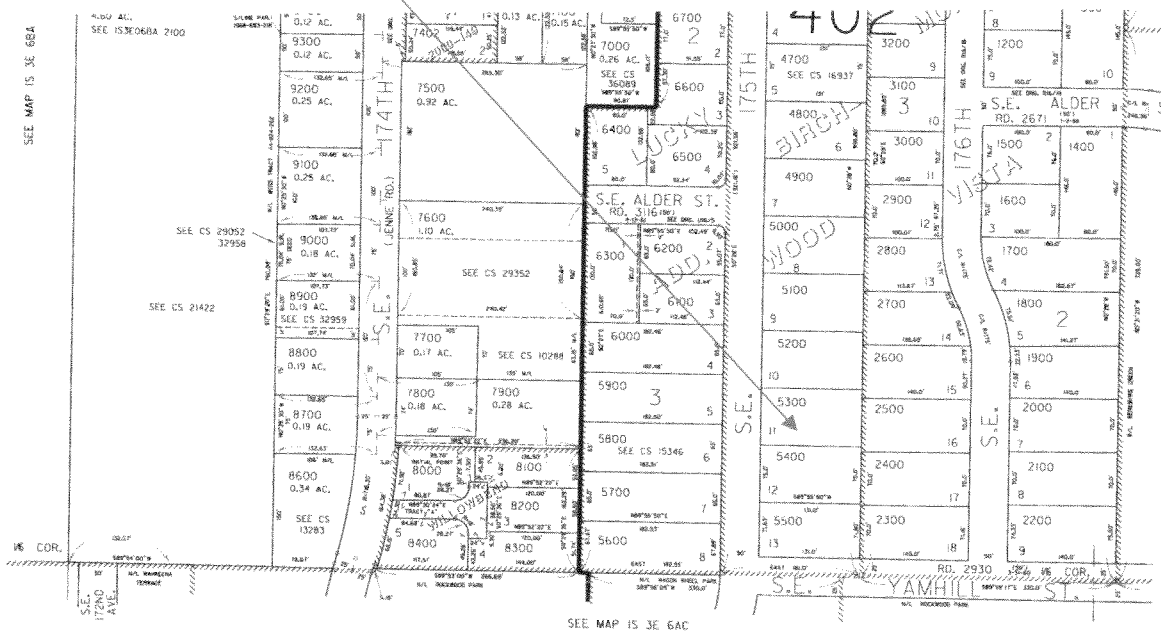

Proposed Auction Properties 2006

1. R116893 – 910 SE 175th Place, Gresham – Came into County ownership through foreclosure on 9/28/04. The house is a one level Ranch style house that has considerable deferred maintenance. The attached garage has been converted to living area. The roof is in poor condition and has caused ceiling leaks in the living room and bathroom. The house constructed in 1957 has had little remodeling. There are 3 bedrooms and 1 bathroom in the main portion of the house. The converted garage has a half bath and small kitchen area. The lot is approximately 9,825 sq ft in size and is fenced. The property was not made available to government agencies or AHDP. Current zoning is TLDR, Transit Low Density Residential.

2. R128255 – Vacant Lot Adjacent to SW Montgomery Drive and Between 1551&1553 SW Upper Hall ST. Came into County ownership through foreclosure 9/23/03. The base of the lot along SW Montgomery Dr slopes very steeply up to SW Upper Hall St. The lot has a brush and tree cover. Because of the shape of the lot at 1553 SW Upper Hall St the subject property is not directly adjacent to SW Upper Hall St as shown on the plat map. Currently zoned R5C and R5.

3. R146498 – 7626 N Central Street – Came into County ownership through foreclosure on 9/28/04. The house is a one level bungalow style house with 2 bedrooms and 1 bathroom with approximately 1,050 sq.ft. on the main floor. The unfinished basement contains approximately 750 sq.ft. and includes a small built in garage. Both the interior and exterior of the house, which was constructed in 1925, have considerable deferred maintenance. The main floor contains some hardwood floors in fair condition. The lot size is 4,368 sq ft. Zoning is R5.

4. R149575 – Vacant Lot Adjacent to 6639 SE Yamhill Ct. Lot came into County ownership through foreclosure on 9/29/97. The lot is approximately 42' x 75' and contains approximately 3,150 sq ft. The parcel was made available to non-profits. The deck and a portion of the house located at 6639 SE Yamhill Ct encroach onto the subject parcel. We are working on an easement to be placed on that portion of the lot that the improvements encroach on.

5. & 6. R242367 & R242374 – N Columbia Blvd and North of the former 9233 N Calvert - Two vacant lots that came into County ownership 9/26/2000. The two lots combined total approximately 35,300 sq ft of area and are zoned IH, Heavy Industrial. There have been numerous past uses of the property including metals recovery, smelting operations, and decommissioning of PCB containing transformers. Two underground storage tanks are located at the site apparently abandoned by a previous owner. In 1998 an Expanded Preliminary Assessment (XPA) was completed by the State of Oregon, DEQ and included sampling and analysis of surface soil. The XPA confirmed the release of hazardous substances and petroleum products to the surface soil at the site. In May 2005 a Phase II Environmental Site Assessment including 25 soil borings was completed by Kleinfelder. The text of this assessment is being reviewed by DEQ and their recommendations will be forthcoming.

7. R288348 – Vacant Lot Adjacent to NW St Helens Rd & 10231 NW 110th Ave – Came into County ownership through foreclosure on 9/29/97. Located in the Town of Linnton just off of NW St Helens Road. It is located on a slight hillside with a brush and tree cover. Dimensions of the lot are approximately 25' on the east west sides, 68' on the North line and 58' on the Southerly line. Total area is approximately 6,300 sq ft. The lot was made available to government agencies and non-profits.

8. R290595 – Vacant Lot Between 145 SE 4th and 324 SE Dora, Troutdale - Came into County ownership through foreclosure on 9/28/04. Mostly level in a residential area. Not made available to government agencies or non-profits. The lot is approximately 50' x 100' and contains approximately 5,000 sq ft.

9. R315019 – Strip of Land Adjacent to Storage Yard at 259 NE Gertz Road – Came into County ownership through foreclosure on 9/24/02. The parcel is zoned EG2h, General Employment. The property fronts on NE Gertz Road.

10. R315421 – Vacant lot surrounded by 5 different improved properties near NE 34th & Simpson – Came into County ownership through foreclosure on 3/30/84. The lot is approximately 50' x 66' in dimension containing approximately 3,300 sq ft. It was made available to government agencies and non-profits. There is no physical access to the parcel.

11. R328905 - Vacant lot adjacent to 2521 SW Bertha Blvd. Came into County ownership through foreclosure on 9/19/2001. The lot is approximately 85' x 92'. Tree and brush covered. Slopes down steeply from both SW Bertha Blvd and SW Beaverton Hillsdale Highway.

The Multnomah County Board of Commissioners Finds:

- a) Multnomah County has foreclosed for delinquent real property taxes eleven properties more particularly described in Exhibit A.
- b) Multnomah County now holds title to the above referenced properties as authorized under ORS 312.200.
- c) These eleven properties are not needed for County purposes or use; it is deemed to be in the best interest of the County to offer said properties at a public sale in accordance with the provisions of ORS 275.110 through 275.190.

The Multnomah County Board of Commissioners Resolves:

- 1. The Multnomah County Sheriff is directed to conduct a public sale and provide for notice of the sale in compliance with ORS 275.110 through ORS 275.190; at a time and place to be determined, of the properties described in the attached Exhibit A for not less than the minimum price set for each property therein.
- 2. The terms of the sale shall require all properties that sell for \$4000 or less be sold for cash. Properties that sell for \$4001 or more may be sold for cash or on contract at 6.0% interest if contract requirements are met as provided in ORS 275.190.



INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT

BURGLAR ALARM TASK FORCE

This agreement is made and entered into pursuant to the authority found in ORS 190.010 et seq. and ORS 206.345 by and between Multnomah County Sheriff's Office (MCSO), jointly with and on behalf of Multnomah County (County), and City of Troutdale (City).

RECITALS

WHEREAS, both the City (Troutdale Municipal Code Chapter 8.12), Exhibit A, and County (Multnomah County Code Chapter 15.700) have in force provisions which regulate the installation and use of burglar and robbery alarm systems; and

WHEREAS, the parties desire to enter into this agreement to govern the administration of Troutdale Municipal Code Chapter 8.12 in accordance with those mutual terms and conditions set forth hereafter, NOW, THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

I. TASK FORCE:

1. MCSO shall facilitate a countywide Burglar Alarm Task Force consisting of representatives of MCSO, incorporated cities within Multnomah County, and the alarm industry to work on methods of reducing false alarms. The Task Force shall operate by consensus.
2. MCSO agrees to arrange for meetings of the Task Force. MCSO agrees to prepare the meeting facility and any information or items that the Task Force needs in order to conduct its business.
3. MCSO agrees to provide any secretarial support of the Task Force. Such secretarial support includes but is not limited to preparing the minutes of all meetings held by the Task Force and distributing the minutes to all interested parties within fifteen (15) days following the meeting.
4. The county-wide Task Force duties shall include but are not limited to the following:
 - a. Review and approval of the MCSO Alarm Ordinance Unit's final proposed budget and any revisions;
 - b. The review and approval of all MCSO Alarm Ordinance Unit policies that impact the services provided by the Alarm Ordinance Unit.
5. The Task Force shall review information and policy presented to the alarm industry; all information and policy shall be mutually agreed upon by all Task Force participants.

II. THE PARTIES AGREE:

1. The CITY grants the County the authority to enforce and administer Chapter 8.12 of the Troutdale Municipal Code in the CITY. The County accepts this authority and agrees to enforce and administer Chapter 8.12 according to its terms and the terms herein.
2. The MCSO shall:
 - a. Administer Troutdale Municipal Code Chapter 8.12 according to its terms.
 - b. Use a computer based system to maintain industry and user files, send false alarm notices, send fee letters, track false alarms, renew permits, and provide statistical information.
 - c. Send notices of false alarms, fees, and suspension of service due to excessive alarms, within four (4) working days of receiving the information from the Bureau of Emergency Communications (BOEC). Notices of permit renewal shall be sent thirty days prior to permit holders' renewal date. At least one late renewal notice shall be sent within two weeks of a failure to renew a permit.
 - d. Provide the City with computer assisted statistical information about alarms within the City, to include but not be limited to:
 - 1) Total number of new applications, renewal permits, and deleted permits processed.
 - 2) Revenues received by type (permit fees, false alarm fees, etc.).
 - 3) Alarm statistics shall be furnished monthly, no later than the 10th of each month.
 - 4) Provide the City access to the MCSO alarm files by way of a computer interconnect; provided such access does not permit ability to enter or delete data.
3. The City may:
 - a. Provide a City representative who will be responsible for liaison between the City and MCSO and the development of City programs targeted at reducing false alarms.

- b. Collaborate with the MCSO on the production of brochures, media products, and public information items, which will be produced under logo of all participating jurisdictions and will be mutually agreed upon.

4. Finance:

- a. MCSO will provide year-end financial reports of all Alarm Ordinance Unit expenditures, no later than September 30th of each calendar year.
- b. MCSO shall seek authorization from the Task Force to allot monies in excess of \$5,000 for any aggregate expenditure that is non-emergency in nature. Emergency expenditures in excess of \$5,000 may be made upon verbal notice to Task Force members.
- c. "Emergency" is any unforeseen occurrence between quarterly Task Force meetings requiring unbudgeted expenditure of over \$5,000 that is necessary to continue operation of the Alarm Ordinance Unit.
- d. The alarm permit fee collected under TMC Chapter 8.12 shall be allocated to Multnomah County for the administration of the alarm ordinance.
- e. All fees collected for false alarms will be transferred, in their entirety, to the City on a quarterly basis within 30 days of the end of each quarter. The revenue transfer will occur in the months of October, January, April, and July of each year. Fees collected and transferred to the City are to offset costs for alarm response.
- f. All fees and forfeitures of security deposits collected pursuant to Chapter 8.12, and administered by Multnomah County officers or employees, will be revenue of Multnomah County; provided, however, that Multnomah County shall maintain records sufficient to identify the sources and amounts of that revenue.
- g. Multnomah County shall maintain records in accordance with sound accounting principles sufficient to determine on a fiscal year basis the direct costs of administering Chapter 8.12 by Multnomah County officers or employees, including salaries and wages (excluding the Sheriff individually), travel, office supplies, postage, printing, facilities, office equipment and other property chargeable costs.
- h. Not later than September 30th of each year, Multnomah County shall render an account to the City for administering Chapter 8.12. The account shall establish the net excess revenue or cost deficit for the preceding fiscal year and shall allocate that excess revenue, if any, or deficit, if any, to the County and the City proportionately as the number of permits issued for alarm systems within the corporate limits of the city bears to the whole number of permits issued in

Multnomah County; provided, that no allocation shall be made if the net excess revenue or deficit is less than \$2,500.00.

- i. Distribution by the county of any excess revenue amounts by the city shall be made not later than September 30th of each fiscal year.
- j. "Sound accounting principles" as used in this section, shall include, but not be limited to, practices required by the terms of any state or federal grant or regulations applicable thereto which relate to the purpose of Chapter 8.12.

III. EFFECTIVE AND TERMINATION DATES

This agreement shall be retroactively effective to July 1, 2005 and shall remain in effect until there is no government law enforcement response to burglar and robbery alarms in the City, or until terminated by either party on sixty (60) days written notice of such termination to the other party.

VI. AMENDMENTS

The MCSO and the City may amend this agreement at any time only by written amendment, agreed to by both parties.

VII. COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS

In connection with its activities under this agreement, MCSO and City shall comply with all applicable federal, state, and local laws and regulations.

VII. OREGON LAW AND FORUM

1. This agreement shall be construed according to the laws of the State of Oregon.
2. Any litigation between the MCSO and City arising under this agreement or out of work performed under this agreement of issues not finally resolved by arbitration as provided in Section XI of this agreement, shall occur, if in the state courts, in the Multnomah County Court having jurisdiction thereof, and if in the federal courts, in the United States District Court for the District of Oregon.

IX. INDEMNIFICATION

1. Subject to the limitations of the Oregon Torts Claims Act and the Oregon Constitution, MCSO and the COUNTY shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless CITY, its officers, employees and agents from all claims, suits, actions or expenses of any nature resulting from or arising out of the acts, errors or omissions of MCSO personnel acting pursuant to the terms of the Agreement.
2. Subject to the limitations of the Oregon Torts Claims Act and the Oregon Constitution, CITY shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless COUNTY and MCSO, their officers, employees and agents from all claims, suits, actions or expenses of any nature resulting from or arising out of the acts, errors, or omissions of CITY personnel acting pursuant to the terms of this Agreement.

X. ASSIGNMENT

Neither the City nor MCSO shall assign this agreement, in whole or in part, or any right or obligation hereunder, without the prior written approval of the other.

SCHOOL-BASED HEALTH CENTERS 11-14 INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT

The parties to this Agreement ("Parties") are School District No. 1J, Multnomah County, Oregon, a school district of the State of Oregon ("District"), and Multnomah County, a political subdivision of the State of Oregon, acting by and through the Multnomah County Health Department ("County"). The Parties enter into this Agreement pursuant to ORS Chapter 190 (Intergovernmental Cooperation).

RECITALS

A. The County and the District have partnered for almost twenty years to provide comprehensive School-Based Health Center ("SBHC") services to District students and desire to continue that partnership. The goal of the SBHC program is to provide age-appropriate, culturally sensitive, and accessible primary and preventative health care, mental health care, and health education in the schools in order to ensure readiness to learn, improve school attendance, reduce risk behaviors contributing to teen pregnancy, and generally promote healthy lifestyle choices by students.

B. The County is the service provider, and the District makes space available in its schools and facilitates access to the program by District students. The purpose of this intergovernmental agreement ("Agreement") is to describe the rights and obligations of the parties and to establish how the parties will cooperate in order to ensure the most effective delivery of service.

AGREEMENT

1. Obligations of the Parties. The Parties mutually agree as follows:

1.1 Coordination of Programs and Resources. The Parties agree that coordination by the parties will enhance the implementation of SBHC in the most cost-effective manner.

1.2 Appropriation of Funds. Each party recognizes that the other parties to this Agreement are public bodies subject to the State of Oregon Local Budget Law (ORS Chapter 294). Each party's obligations and promises under this Agreement are therefore subject to the annual appropriation of funds by each party's respective governing body. Failure of a party to comply with the terms and conditions of this Agreement shall not be considered a breach of this Agreement if such failure is based upon a funding decision made by its governing body pursuant to the local budget process.

2. Obligations of the County. The County will be solely responsible for providing and managing SBHC services, including hiring, firing and supervising of SBHC employees and contractors, billing Medicaid or other third-party insurers for services, and ensuring that all employees and contractors have the appropriate licenses and qualifications to perform the services. The County agrees as follows:

2.1 Appointment of a County Liaison. The County appoints the Multnomah County Health Department Director as its chief liaison with the District regarding program-wide

issues. Site specific program issues will be addressed by the site program manager and the school principal.

2.2 **SBHC Services.** The County will provide SBHC services solely to enrolled students of the District, unless otherwise approved by the school principal. The County has discretion to provide the services it deems necessary and appropriate. These services may include, but are not limited to:

- (a) Routine physical exams, including sports physicals.
- (b) Diagnosis and treatment of acute and chronic illness.
- (c) Treatment of minor injuries.
- (d) Vision, dental and blood pressure screenings.
- (e) Age-appropriate reproductive health services, including abstinence counseling, education, exams, birth control, sexually transmitted disease ("STD") tests, emergency contraceptives, and referrals.
- (f) Immunizations.
- (g) Health education, counseling, and wellness promotion.
- (h) Nutrition education and weight management.
- (i) Prescription medications.
- (j) Mental health services.
- (k) Classroom presentations.
- (l) Referrals for services not available at the school-based health center.

The County's obligation to provide such programs is subject to annual appropriation as provided in Section 1.2

2.3 **SBHC Locations.** The County currently operates an SBHC at each of the following schools:

- (a) Cleveland High School.
- (b) Grant High School.
- (c) Jefferson High School Campus
- (d) Madison High School.
- (e) Marshall High School Campus.

- (f) Roosevelt High School Campus.
- (g) Binnsmead Middle School
- (h) George Middle School
- (i) Lane Middle School
- (j) Portsmouth Middle School

Should the County seek to add additional SBHC at additional schools within the District, the County will confer with the District about appropriate locations.

2.4 Tenant Improvements/Equipment. The County will construct as its sole cost any improvements to District property necessary to provide the SBHC services and will provide all furnishings and equipment for such services. Any modification or improvement to District facilities must be reviewed and approved by the school principal and by the District's Director of Facilities Management.

2.5 Service Provision. The County will provide SBHC services using County staff or pursuant to a County contract with a private provider.

(a) The County will, and will require its contractors as a condition of each contract, to:

(i) Collect and maintain the executed Release attached as Exhibit 1 from the parent or guardian of all students of all students participating in the SBHC program except students who are 15 years old or older or students of any age obtaining family planning or services for diagnosis and treatment of sexually transmitted diseases.

(ii) Comply with the District's Criminal History Verification requirements at the County or contractor's expense for all employees who will have unsupervised contact with students as a result of the provision of services under this Agreement. The County and its contractors will ensure compliance with this requirement by each employee before that employee may begin providing services under this Agreement.

(iii) Require that all staff that obtain or learn confidential information while providing services under this Agreement not disclose such information to third parties unless parent/guardian written consent has been obtained. Confidential information includes, but is not limited to confidential student information under the Family Education Rights and Privacy Act, 20 USC § 1232g ("FERPA"), and Oregon state regulations regarding education records, OAR 581-021-0220 to 581-021-0440 ("Oregon Student Records Regulations").

(iv) Provide the following information to school principals:

- (1) Copies of the signed Release forms.

(2) Copies of the executed District Criminal History Verification forms.

(b) The County will be responsible for ensuring that its employees and contractors comply with the requirements set forth in Section 2.6 of this Agreement.

2.6 Provision of Additional Information by County. At the District's written request, the County will provide additional information or data as needed to satisfy other reporting requirements or District needs. The County will provide such information within 30 days of the date of the District's written request.

2.7 Confidentiality; Indemnification. The County will ensure that its employees and contractors maintain the confidentiality of student information under FERPA and Oregon Student Records Regulations. The County will work collaboratively with the District to provide information and training on confidentiality to staff and contractors. The County shall defend, indemnify, and hold the District, its officers, agents, and employees, harmless against all liability, loss, cost, or expenses, including attorney fees, and against all claims, actions, or judgments based upon or arising out of disclosure of confidential information that is in any way connected with the provision of SBHC services by the County, its officers, agents, employees, and subcontractors. This contractual indemnity provision does not abrogate common law or statutory liability and indemnification to the District, but is in addition to such common law or statutory provisions.

2.8 SBHC Medical records/HIPAAESIS. Medical records are the property of the County and will be subject to the County's policies related to the confidentiality of the medical records. Such records will be maintained in locked files and will be accessible to County SBHC staff only. County will be responsible for complying with the Health Insurance Portability & Accountability Act of 1996 (August 21), Public Law 104-191 ("HIPAA") with regard to the County and the District. SBHC personnel shall not have unauthorized access to confidential student information contained in the District's Electronic Student Information System ("ESIS").

3. Obligations of the District. The District is not a direct service provider of SBHC programs. The District's primary obligations under this Agreement are to provide access to and space at District Schools, and to work collaboratively with the County to implement and support the SBHC Program. The District agrees as follows:

3.1 Appointment of District Liaison; Responsibilities. The Superintendent will designate a District staff person to supervise the District's participation in the SBHC Program. ("District Liaison"). The District Liaison may designate additional District liaisons as he or she deems necessary for specific programs or locations. The District Liaison or designee will notify the County of any concerns or unsatisfactory performance by any staff person or subcontracted SBHC service provider and support the County's investigation and resolution of the performance issues. The District will not be considered a co-employer of any County, or County Subcontractor staff person, and the County agrees that they will not make any allegations to the contrary in the prosecution or defense of any suit or other claim or proceeding regarding such staff person. Site specific program issues will be addressed by the site program manager and the school principal.

3.2 Use of School Facilities. The District will provide space in its school facilities for SBHC programs, and will provide heat, electricity, a phone line and janitorial services. The District will not charge the County any rent or other user fee for such use of its facilities, but reserves the right to unilaterally impose rent or a cost-recovery fee in the future as may be determined necessary by the District Board of Education pursuant to the District's annual budget process. The District retains final authority over use of its facilities, including the siting of SBHC services in its schools.

3.3 Information and Communication. The District will permit the County to distribute promotional and informational materials for the SBHC Program at all District facilities and through the District's internal mail system. Such access is conditioned on compliance with District policies and United States Postal Service regulations with regard to distribution of materials. The District will not be responsible for paying for any such materials.

3.4 Obligations of District at Each School Site. District principals of schools with SBHCs will:

(a) Provide demographic and academic data on individual students. This data constitutes education records under FERPA, and Oregon Student Records Regulations. Before the District will release such information, the Release must be signed by the appropriate parent or guardian and be on file with the District. The school will not provide SBHC staff with direct access to its cSIS database.

(b) Collaborate with SBHC program managers in a manner that ensures that students in need of assistance are encouraged to seek services.

4. General Provisions.

4.1 Term. The term of this Agreement is perpetual, unless terminated as provided in Section 4.2, below.

4.2 Termination.

(a) This Agreement may be terminated for convenience by any party by providing sixty (60) days written notice of termination to the other party.

(b) This Agreement may be terminated for cause by any party by providing thirty (30) days written notice of breach of contract to the breaching party. This Agreement will not be terminated if the breaching party cures the breach prior to conclusion of the notice period.

4.3 Amendments. This Agreement may be amended only by an instrument in writing executed by both parties, which writing must specifically refer to this Agreement.

4.4 Assignment. Except as otherwise provided in this Agreement, neither this Agreement nor any of the rights, interests, or obligations under this Agreement will be assigned by any party without the prior written consent of the other parties.

4.5 **No Third-Party Beneficiaries.** Nothing in this Agreement, express or implied, is intended or will be construed to confer on any person, other than the parties to this Agreement, any right, remedy, or claim under or with respect to this Agreement.

4.6 **Relationship of Parties.** The Parties acknowledge that each party to this Agreement is an independent contractor and that nothing in this Agreement is intended, and nothing will be construed, to create any form of partnership or joint venture relationship among the parties, or to allow any party to exercise control or direction over another party, provided always that the services to be provided hereunder by the Parties will be furnished in a manner consistent with the terms of this Agreement.

4.7 **Construction.** The captions used in this Agreement are provided for convenience only and do not affect the meaning or interpretation of any provision of this Agreement. All references in this Agreement to "Section" or "Sections" without additional identification refer to the section or sections of this Agreement. All words used in this Agreement are to be construed to be of such gender or number as the circumstances require. Whenever the words "include" or "including" are used in this Agreement, they will be deemed to be followed by the words "without limitation."

4.8 **Counterparts.** This Agreement may be executed in counterparts, each of which will be considered an original and all of which together will constitute one and the same Agreement.

4.9 **Facsimile Signatures.** Facsimile transmission of any signed original document, and retransmission of any signed facsimile transmission, will be the same as delivery of an original. At the request of any party, the parties will confirm facsimile transmitted signatures by signing an original document.

4.10 **Expenses.** Except as otherwise expressly provided in this Agreement, each party to this Agreement will bear that party's own expenses in connection with the preparation, execution, and performance of this Agreement and the transactions contemplated by this Agreement.

4.11 **Waiver.** Any provision or condition of this Agreement may be waived at any time, in writing, by the party entitled to the benefit of such provision or condition. Waiver of any breach of any provision will not constitute a waiver of any succeeding breach of the provision or a waiver of the provision itself or any other provision.

4.12 **Indemnification.** Subject to limits of the Oregon Tort Claims Act, each party will indemnify and defend the other parties, their employees, agents, representatives, and affiliates (the "Indemnified Parties") and hold them harmless from and against any and all losses, liabilities, damages, demands, claims, suits, actions, judgments, assessments, costs, and expenses, including without limitation interest, penalties, attorney fees, any and all expenses incurred in investigating, preparing, or defending against any litigation, commenced or threatened, or any claim whatsoever, and any and all amounts paid in settlement of any claim or litigation asserted against, imposed on, or incurred or suffered by any of them, directly or

indirectly, as a result of or arising from the acts or omissions of the indemnifying party, its employees, contractors, or other agents or representatives.

4.13 **Insurance.** The City, County and District are each self-insured in accordance with the provisions of the Oregon Tort Claims Act, ORS 30.270. The Parties agree to comply with this statute for the term of this Agreement. The County will require all of its contractors to maintain commercial general liability insurance, automobile liability insurance, and statutory workers compensation coverage (unless exempt), and will require medical malpractice insurance and/or errors & emissions insurance as appropriate, in amounts acceptable to the District's Director of Risk Management. The County will require its contractors to include an endorsement naming the District as an additional insured on the Contractor's CGL and automobile liability policies.

4.14 **Governing Law.** This Agreement is to be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the state of Oregon, without regard to conflict-of-laws principles.

4.15 **Venue.** Any judicial action or proceeding seeking to enforce any provision of, or based on any right arising out of, this Agreement is to be brought against any of the parties in Multnomah County Circuit Court of the State of Oregon, and each of the parties consents to the jurisdiction of such court (and of the appropriate appellate court) in any such action or proceeding, and waives any objection to such venue.

4.16 **Exhibits.** Any exhibits referenced in this Agreement are a part of this Agreement as if fully set forth in this Agreement.

4.17 **Severability.** If any provision of this Agreement is held to be invalid or unenforceable in any respect for any reason, the validity and enforceability of any such provision in any other respect and of the remaining provisions of this Agreement will not be in any way impaired.

4.18 **Compliance with Law.** Each party shall comply with all federal, state and local laws and ordinances applicable to this Agreement.

4.19 **Non-discrimination.** Each party shall comply with all requirements of federal and state civil rights and rehabilitation statutes and local non-discrimination ordinances.

4.20 **Access to Records.** Each party shall have access to the books, documents, and other records of the others which are related to this Agreement for the purpose of examination, copying, and audit, unless otherwise limited or restricted by law.





The Department of Community Justice (DCJ) requests approval of a budget modification to appropriate an additional \$38,471 from the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation to fund 80% of a .5 FTE Treatment Expeditor and provide professional services for the Reclaiming Futures Initiative Program in the Juvenile Services Division.

This grant award changes program offer 50053. This is the fourth year of a five-year initiative to provide more treatment, better treatment and greater support to help youth with drug and alcohol problems stop using drugs, stop committing crimes and stay in school. The project works with judges, attorneys, probation, schools, and treatment programs to improve the effectiveness and accountability of youth treatment. The initiative is designed to

improve access to treatment and treatment outcomes for delinquent youth. The initiative has helped to increase treatment for Latinos and helped create the Communities of Color Partnership which provides coordinated and culturally appropriate school, employment, and mentoring to 80 high-risk youth of color in treatment.

This budget modification includes revenue and expenditures covering the period December 1, 2005 through June 30, 2006.

The Robert Wood Johnson Foundation additional amount of \$38,471 provides funding for 80% of a .5 FTE Treatment Expeditor to oversee the connection of youth to treatment. 

Dear Friend of the Courts,

Multnomah County is required by state statute to provide a circuit court facility in the City of Gresham. For the last quarter-century, court services have been provided to East County residents through a single courtroom located within the old Gresham City Hall. Today, the aging facility, with a host of maintenance issues, is inadequate and costly to maintain. Studies over the past four years recommend a new multi-courtroom facility in Gresham. I have pledged my support to make that happen.

Next Thursday, the Board of County Commissioners is poised to consider a resolution to move forward with a project plan for a four-courtroom East County Court Facility. (See attachment.) This proposal has the support of a majority of the board and could move forward immediately.

However, an organized effort to oppose this plan has been launched. Critics instead want to construct an expanded justice facility in the Rockwood neighborhood incorporating courtrooms, Sheriff's law enforcement operations, and possibly the Gresham Police Department. Currently, the County is considering transfer of some Sheriff's law enforcement operations to other jurisdictions and there is no plan in place to relocate the Gresham Police. The need for an expanded facility is simply not warranted. *It is my firm belief that the County should not place itself in the position of building a grand facility when much of the space may be immediately mothballed.* Further, to locate a court facility outside of Gresham's municipal core in Rockwood would certainly enhance an economically struggling neighborhood, but it is not a judicious choice for those that actively participate in Multnomah County's Circuit Court system.

I hope you agree that it is time to move forward with a prudent plan that immediately addresses the pressing judicial needs of the Multnomah County Circuit Court. **I invite your support and testimony at this Thursday's County Commission meeting. Please arrive no later than 9:40 a.m., Multnomah Building, First Floor Commissioners Boardroom 100, 501 SE Hawthorne Boulevard, Portland. If public support for a new courts-only facility is lacking, it will be difficult for the Board to back this proposal in the face of strident opposition. Directing Facilities and Property Management to Prepare a Major Facilities Capital Project Plan for an East County Court Facility Consisting of Four Courtrooms (With Expansion Capability to Six Courtrooms) and Associated Offices and Redirecting Funds to Construction of Such a Facility

The Multnomah County Board of Commissioners Finds:

- a. Oregon Revised Statute 1.185 requires counties in which a circuit court is located to provide "suitable and sufficient courtrooms, office and jury rooms."
- b. Oregon Revised Statute 3.014(2) further requires Multnomah County to "provide facilities in the City of Gresham for a court judge to hold court..."
- c. For the last quarter-century, court services have been provided to East County residents through a single courtroom located within the old Gresham City Hall. The circa 1950s building was renovated in 1980 to accommodate the court, but maintenance issues (energy inefficiencies, a patchwork roof in need of replacement) and full ADA compliance requirements remain pressing and costly challenges.
- d. The 2002 Multnomah County Courthouse Renovation Study by HOK Consulting concluded, "As part of the long-term court space strategy, establishing some limited-service courts in Gresham would increase convenience to East County residents."
- e. The 2003 Courthouse Recommendation by the Courthouse Blue Ribbon Steering Committee also suggests that additional court facilities in Gresham are a key part of the solution to a county-wide growing need for courtrooms. The Recommendation concludes that a four courtroom facility with expansion capability to six courtrooms in East County/Gresham is necessary to meet the needs of the Fourth Judicial Circuit Court's over the next twenty years. The lone courtroom in Gresham is no longer able to accommodate the current judicial caseload.
- f. The 2004 East County Justice Facility Work Group sought to expand the idea of a simple court facility and explored the concept of combining several County public safety functions in one building including the Courts, the Sheriff's law enforcement unit and certain District Attorney offices. In addition, the Work Group's plan provided for the potential for additional City of Gresham law enforcement space.

- g. East County citizens and businesses will benefit from greater proximity to a regional court facility. Time spent in transit by citizens, attorneys and Gresham law enforcement will be significantly reduced; and overall service delivery to victims and those called to testify will be greatly enhanced.
- h. On March 11, 2004, by Resolution 04-028 the Board authorized a work group chaired by Commissioner Roberts to make recommendations with cost options and cost benefit analysis for an East County justice facility.
- i. In November 2004, the Board found it in the interest of both the County and the Sheriff's Office to explore the cost-saving potential and the desirability of moving the Sheriff's enforcement operations now located at the Hansen Building into a new East County Justice Facility. By Resolution 04-159 the Board directed preparation of a Preliminary Planning Proposal for an East County Justice Facility. By Resolution 04-159, the Board further declared its intent to earmark funds from the sale of the Hansen Building, MCCF and Edgefield properties for construction of an East County Justice Facility. The Board also earmarked proceeds from the Hansen Building sale to create permanent facilities for MCSO law enforcement if construction of the Justice Facility does not occur.
- j. On February 17, 2005, by Resolution 05-031 the Board approved a Preliminary Planning Proposal for an East County Justice Facility and directed the Facilities and Property Management Division to prepare a Project Proposal for Board review.
- k. On May 12, 2005 by Resolution 05-076 the Board approved the Project Proposal for an East County Justice Facility and directed the Facilities and Property Management Division to prepare a Project Plan for Board Review.
- l. It may no longer be desirable to retain all law enforcement operations, and it may be in the best interest of County residents to transfer some law enforcement operations to other jurisdictions. The Sheriff's Office has indicated that law enforcement is "at a crossroads." Over the past 20 years the Sheriff's Office has changed from a full-service police agency directly serving nearly 200,000 people to an agency with vastly diminished patrol areas serving less than 17,500 citizens. The need to explore efficiencies in the delivery of government services during these fiscally restrained times is magnified by the expiration of the Multnomah County Income Tax. An initial work session on the potential transfer of some law enforcement operations is expected to begin on January 31, 2006.
- m. While the need for a larger, more costly all-encompassing justice facility is diminishing, the pressing need for a court facility in East County remains. The Board desires to use the work previously done on the Preliminary Planning Proposal and the Project Proposal for the East County Justice Facility to prepare a Project Plan for an East County Court Facility consisting of four courtrooms (with expansion capability to six courtrooms) and associated offices.

The Multnomah County Board of Commissioners Resolves:

1. The direction to Facilities and Property Management to prepare a Project Plan for an East County Justice Facility in Resolution 05-076 is withdrawn.
2. It is the intent of the Board that funds earmarked in Resolution 04-159 for construction of an East County Justice Facility be allocated instead to construction of an East County Court Facility located in Gresham consisting of four courtrooms (with expansion capabilities to six courtrooms) and associated offices.
3. It is the intent of the Board that planning for the construction of the East County Court Facility will be in full compliance with Administrative Procedure FAC-1 (implementing Resolution 02-136) and will build upon the Preliminary Planning Proposal and Project Proposal for the East County Justice Facility.
4. If construction of the East County Court Facility does not occur, any alternative use of the sale proceeds from MCCF and Edgefield properties must be authorized by the Board.
5. The Board acknowledges that the relocation of the Sheriff's law enforcement operations – currently housed in the Hansen Building, a building declared surplus and slated for sale – remains an issue. As deliberations into the future of the County's law enforcement operations proceed, it is the intent of the Board to explore opportunities to collocate with local law enforcement partners to address these facility needs.
6. Prior to site acquisition, it is in the best interest of the County to receive assurance from the City of Gresham that it does not intend to duplicate court services in East County by pursuing a municipal court. Facilities and Property Management (FPM) is directed to pursue an intergovernmental agreement with the City of Gresham to receive this assurance.
7. FPM is directed to proceed immediately with preparation of a Project Plan for an East County Court Facility as follows:
 - a) FPM shall, using the information obtained in the preparation of the Preliminary Planning Proposal and the Project Proposal and such additional information as may be necessary or appropriate, submit to the Board a Project Plan for an East County Court Facility consisting of four courtrooms (with expansion capability to six courtrooms) and associated offices, within ninety (90) days.

- b) FPM shall work collaboratively with the City of Gresham, Sheriff's Office, the District Attorney's Office, the Courts and others in this process as appropriate.
- c) FPM shall first look to County-owned properties in making site recommendations to the Board.



When the county-convened committee met in the late nineties to discuss Multnomah County facilities that would include many comprehensive community services, an East County Justice facility was tentatively discussed. This was through a county-led committee with little or no representative citizen participation, consisting of primarily agency representation.

Mindful of the three decades old state statute for an East County court facility, that committee did some preliminary work on an East County Justice facility concept, too. The favored sites of the committee at the time was to locate such a facility either with the developing county complex for health, seniors and disabilities at the present location of Eighth & Kelly in Gresham, or at the then newly-developing Civic Center, combining Gresham City Hall services, police and fire services with the future possibility of expansive county courts and county sheriff services.

The siting was intended to be for an East County Justice facility, not a Rockwood/West Gresham Justice facility. All of East County deserves a coordinated, well-planned, well thought-out Justice facility, with all four East County communities' citizens participating.

This facility should not be built on the premise of the county siphoning off urban renewal dollars from regulated urban renewal processes. It seems there is a pattern of our East County Commissioner in using Urban Renewal dollars for specific county projects. This was true in Gateway Urban Renewal when that Urban Renewal District gave up over a million dollars for a county project*. With a possible Troutdale Urban Renewal District coming up, perhaps Troutdale, too, could give up over a million dollars of their Urban Renewal District for a county project (just kidding, Troutdale, please don't call me!).

I'm not a traffic expert, but I know I usually make better time and fuel savings to downtown Portland on I-84, than driving through traffic and signal lights, as would be the case in reaching Rockwood from any point in East County.

Since none of us has the benefit of a crystal ball, what we do know for certain is that East County definitely needs a new and adequate courthouse facility that will have the capacity to meet present and future East County legal needs, and the funding is available now; with still funding left over to address a fiscally-responsible plan to integrate county justice services at an appropriate East County location that truly serves all of East County.

Rockwood (Urban Renewal) has the opportunity to address its challenging criminal and social issues without displacing those same issues to our neighboring East County communities. Please let our County Commissioners know of your support for a long overdue new East County Courthouse.

RESOLUTION NO. 2810

A RESOLUTION TO ENCOURAGE AND SUPPORT ACTION BY THE MULTNOMAH COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS TO SITE AND CONSTRUCT THE EXPANDED SERVICE COURT FACILITY AND JUSTICE CENTER IN THE CITY OF GRESHAM

The City of Gresham Finds:

A. In 2001, Multnomah County Resolution 01-114 commissioned a study to determine whether to proceed with renovating the Multnomah County Courthouse. The resulting report was issued in June 2002. The June 2002 report concluded, in part, that as part of the long-term court space strategy, establishing a court in Gresham would increase convenience to East County residents.

B. A Courthouse Blue Ribbon Steering Committee was convened in August 2002 with the mission of "developing a comprehensive, clear, sustainable, and cost-effective strategy for meeting Multnomah County's court facilities needs for the next 40 years." The Blue Ribbon Committee's Courthouse Recommendations, issued December 2003, included a recommendation for establishment of a four-courtroom facility, with expansion capability to six courtrooms, in East County/Gresham. Establishment of a courtroom and justice facility in East County/Gresham will provide substantial benefits, including increased convenience, to Gresham residents, and was endorsed by the Gresham City Council on April 20, 2004 through the adoption of Resolution No. 2693.

C. In 2004, Multnomah County Resolution 04-028 created a work group to be chaired by Commissioner Lonnie Roberts to make specific recommendations and a cost analysis regarding a new East County justice facility. Mayor Charles Becker acted as vice-chair of this work group. This work group has completed its work and made various recommendations on location, occupancy, financing, and related matters, and the City of Gresham supports the findings and recommendations of this work group.

D. In 2005, and at the request of the County, the City has indicated its willingness to contribute up to \$2 million towards the construction and/or acquisition costs of the justice facility. This contribution is in consideration for ownership interest and occupancy of approximately 12,000 square feet of space in the facility and the right to participate on the project management team to define a mutually agreeable design, space and parking plans, specifications, and other details relating to the project. Although the specific financing of this contribution has not been determined, i.e., County financing under an agreed upon plan, in-kind payments other than cash such as fee waivers or infrastructure costs, urban renewal funds (depending on the location of the facility), community block grant funds, etc., the City and County have expressed their willingness to explore all possible options.

E. From time to time, and for reasons wholly unrelated to the issues surrounding the Blue Ribbon Committee Multnomah County Courthouse study and the Commissioner Roberts/Mayor Becker East County Justice Center work group, the City of Gresham has considered reestablishment of a municipal court in the City of Gresham. More specifically, in 1998 the City Attorney's Office completed an evaluation and preliminary financial assessment of the feasibility of a municipal court. At that time, the City Council concluded that such a court was not financially feasible.

F. In 2002, the City Council appointed a citizen task force to again review the possible reestablishment of a municipal court. In its 2003 report, the task force found that a full-service courthouse facility in the City of Gresham would be of greater benefit to the citizens and businesses of Gresham and East County than a municipal court. The task force also recommended that the city work with Multnomah County and the state court system to enhance the current court services in Gresham.

pending county action on the Blue Ribbon Committee's recommendation that a full-service courthouse and justice center be established in East County. The City Council agreed and took no action on the municipal court at that time.

G. In 2005, following the appointment of Gresham's first City Auditor, an audit report on the subject of a municipal court was requested by the City Council. The auditor's report was designed to review the 1998 and 2003 municipal court studies and to very summarily assess the financial aspects of a municipal court with limited jurisdiction. This audit report was completed in August 2005 and discussed at the August 23, 2005 roundtable meeting. The City Council took no action at this meeting, but agreed to revisit the topic in the next 60 days depending on the action taken by the County Board of Commissioners relative to the East County Justice Center Project. The County has declined to take formal action on the project due, in part, to uncertainty surrounding the City's position on a municipal court.

H. The Gresham City Council remains committed to working with the County to establish an expanded service courthouse and East County Justice Center within the City of Gresham. Since the time of the August 23 roundtable meeting, the City Council has also determined that while a municipal court remains a topic of interest, further study, a comprehensive financial evaluation, and a detailed business plan would be required. The City does not have the staff or financial resources to undertake a comprehensive study or otherwise pursue a municipal court. The City's position in this regard was set forth in a letter to the Multnomah County Board of Commissioner's dated September 20, 2005 and in a second letter on or about September 30.

I. On September 25, 2005 Mayor Becker and City Attorney Susan Bischoff met with Multnomah County Presiding Judge Dale Koch to discuss the court's plan for expanded court services in East County. Although Judge Koch did not envision significant civil trials or felony matters being handled in Gresham, court services, including civil filings, restraining orders, and some motion practice would be provided. The current statutory jurisdiction of a Gresham court would be continued. Judge Koch also indicated that the court stands ready and willing to increase local code enforcement and/or parking enforcement services should the city's demand for such service increase.

J. Although the City Council recognizes that it may lack the legal authority to bind future governing boards of the City, Council wishes to formally express the City's intention to defer or otherwise forgo the creation of a municipal court in Gresham, provided that the East County Justice Center as currently contemplated between the City and County is constructed within the next three years.

THE CITY OF GRESHAM RESOLVES:

1. The City of Gresham is committed to the current East County Justice Center project and the recommendations made by the Commissioner Roberts/Mayor Becker work group in its written report.

2. Subject to the necessary budgetary appropriations and financing plan, the City remains committed to making a financial contribution to the justice facility project.

3. The City of Gresham will forgo the creation of a municipal court in Gresham provided that the East County Justice Center project is completed or substantially completed within the next three years.

4. The Gresham City Council strongly encourages the County Board of Commissioners to take immediate steps to implement the recommendations of the Commissioner Roberts/Mayor Becker workgroup, and proceed with this important justice facility project for the benefit of all East Multnomah County.

5. The City of Gresham looks forward to working with the County Board of Commissioners in the days and months ahead to collaboratively resolve the many issues facing the citizens and businesses in East Multnomah County.







Dear County Commissioners,

I regret my schedule doesn't allow me to join you at your regular meeting on Jan. 12, 2006 to provide direct testimony in regard to the proposed Department of Community Justice. However, I would like to submit my comments to you through this letter and I thank you for the opportunity to do so.

In regard to the issue of increased county revenue and the proposal of a supplemental budget for this fiscal year, I would like to offer the following considerations. First, Multnomah County, just like the school districts, must prepare for the sunset of the personal income tax and the impact that lost revenue will have on all of us. For Multnomah County schools and children, the loss of this revenue represents a significant loss and will result in the reduction of many vital services. At the same time, reductions in and changes to mental health services and the Department of Human Services financial struggles mean schools must do more for children with fewer resources.

Rather than spend any extra income this fiscal year, it would seem prudent to conclude the year as planned and use the extra income as savings to bolster and backfill what we know will be a reduction in services across the county in 2006-07. Create a "rainy day fund" because the clouds are on the horizon.

In regard to the proposed Community Justice Center in the Rockwood community, there is no question this neighborhood needs revitalization and increased services. I hope any services proposed for Rockwood will include more than just courts or a police presence. Rather, Reynolds has long advocated for a service and community center to provide a wide breadth of resources for families and children from social services such as food stamps or job search assistance as well as educational resources such as school district translators and possibly classroom space for adults and children.

However, as a school superintendent, I can't pretend to understand the nuances or challenges the city and county face in the proposal of a cooperative justice center. I must leave that issue and cooperation to you as a County Board.

Your Public Schools...there's no better place to learn.

We appreciate the increased attention the Board of Commissioners in general and Commissioner Lonnie Roberts in particular have given to Rockwood, it's children and it's families. This neighborhood has faced challenges but by working together, I believe these challenges are surmountable and we can do better for Rockwood.

Dear Madam Chair and Commissioners:

I had hoped to appear in person at the hearing this morning but was not able to do so. I hope it is not too late for me to add these comments to the record. My views are strictly my own, and are not offered on behalf of my partners, any client, or any Bar organization. Thank you in advance for your consideration.

I am a 1970 graduate of Centennial High School. I spent my teen years in the Rockwood area, and am fully familiar with the dynamics of that community and its transition since I lived there. I have been a civil lawyer in this county since 1980. In the last several years I have also served as a member of the Multnomah Bar Association's Court Liaison Committee and on the Multnomah County Courthouse Security Committee, so I am aware of the critical need for expanded justice facilities in Multnomah County, both in East County and in the downtown core. Regardless of your ultimate decision on its nature, I ask that you move forward promptly on some justice facility for East County. The need is great, and the solution is long overdue.

I understand that the two options before the Board are a single-purpose courthouse (4 courtrooms) and a combined justice/public safety facility. I support a multi-purpose facility for several reasons:

- Combining public safety with justice services will add to both the perception and reality of increased public safety in the community, which will in turn increase the neighborhood's desirability.
- There will be increased efficiency and flexibility in staffing courthouse needs, both on a routine basis and for special situations (e.g., high profile criminal matters requiring extra security), when the Sheriff's office has a presence on the premises. Over time, this should lead to cost savings.
- Likewise, an onsite holding facility would allow for more flexibility in prisoner transport, which would also increase public safety and allow for cost savings over time.
- Citizens will benefit from the extra measure of safety and police responsiveness in the courthouse, and the convenience of being able to handle justice-related business in a single location.

In addition to these tangible benefits, there is also the somewhat intangible -- but very real -- benefit of increasing civic awareness of the relationship between public safety and justice services. Every day citizens come to the Multnomah County Courthouse for a variety of personal matters, to resolve their own disputes, to sit on juries with their fellow citizens, and to serve on grand juries weighing criminal evidence. School children visit regularly, to see how our jury system operates and learn firsthand how our rule of law affects them. For many -- maybe most -- of these taxpayers and virtually all of the children, their visit to the courthouse is a new and eye-opening experience. How much more valuable it would be if they also saw the link between judges, lawyers, litigants and defendants, jurors, and officers of the law.

I have heard the concern that a multi-purpose facility might not be fully utilized. I do not have detailed knowledge of the Sheriff's and Police Chief's views on that, but I do know that justice needs have only increased over time. Even a single-purpose facility with 4 courtrooms will eventually be outgrown, probably sooner than expected. To the extent that the public safety areas might not be fully occupied at first, there are justice-related purposes that could be served in the interim; alternative dispute resolution proceedings, depositions, legally mandated parenting classes, and community education are just a few that quickly come to mind. And to the extent that there will likely be a need for more courtrooms down the road, the multi-purpose facility would more readily allow for reconfiguration and remodeling should the need arise.

Two more points. First, I have already sent a short e-mail regarding the tone of this debate. I encourage the Commissioners-- and all interested parties-- to put aside personal issues, "turf concerns," political considerations,

and any other matters that interfere with a thoughtful, focused, productive discussion. This is an important issue, and the Board has an important job to do. Please do it.

Second, perhaps I have missed this part of the discussion, but I do not believe I have heard anything about a daycare in the new facility. I trust that all of the Commissioners have visited the CourtCare program in Multnomah County Circuit Court. It outgrew its space almost as soon as it opened. But any daycare is better than none, and this need is absolutely vital. Please protect our vulnerable young children from exposure to the sordid details of their parents' divorces, custody battles, and criminal proceedings, and from the violent outbursts that sometimes occur in a courthouse. No matter what else you decide, please dedicate space (and better yet, allocate resources) for an onsite daycare program at the new justice facility.

Thank you again for your consideration.

Open letter requested to be read at the Justice Center Hearing scheduled for January 12, 2006 by the Multnomah County Commission.

A couple of years ago, the Multnomah County Commission in a rare public policy discussion, voted to allow a Justice Center to be built in Gresham which would include four court rooms, space for Multnomah County Sheriff Officers and a Gresham Police precinct. The caveat was that Commissioner Lonnie Roberts find money to pay for this essential project.

Commissioner Roberts found money for the funding of this facility through the sale of Multnomah County surplus property. Public hearings, meetings with involved government agencies and business organizations were held. Decisions were made, plans drawn, and East County was getting into some final talks to start this project.

I moved into Gresham in March of 1968 when I was hired as a patrol officer for the Gresham Police Department. I have seen much change since that time. When Rockwood was annexed into Gresham a few years ago, the crime rate was higher than the rest of Gresham, but manageable. Since then, the Portland Housing Authority has purchased numerous apartment properties and the already impoverished Rockwood became a ghetto.

A feeling I have is that Gresham is the Cinderella and the county commission is the wicked step-mother and evil step-sisters. The shining prince, Lonnie Roberts, I feel, is really trying to rescue us.

A Justice Center will go a long way in the necessary positive growth of Rockwood area by exposing the community to 24-hour exposure to numerous patrol officers coming and going and observing the community as they head to their assigned districts. A District Attorney office will cut numerous hours off the potential overtime necessary for officers having to go to the Portland Court House to sign complaints. Citizens will have a much closer opportunity for the same which will

assist in criminal complaints not signed because of the hassle of the Portland downtown.

My sense is that businesses offering family wage positions will never settle in Rockwood until the crime rate is reduced. Believe me, which can only happen with positive law enforcement presence. Without this, the court house will just become another building for the community to vandalize.

Commissioners Naito and Cruz Walsh sent out a press release declaring that the two of them are leading the effort to replace the aging courtroom directly challenging Commissioner Roberts by invading his district and usurping his responsibility. County Commissioners Naito and Cruz Walsh have set out to sabotage this essential Gresham area project and are now doing so publicly.

Backroom collusion, mutiny and hostile take over of the County Government has a corrupt feel to it. In their conspiracy to sabotage Sheriff Giusto and the reelection of Chair Diane Linn, the Portland Commissioners have declared their will onto all Multnomah County voters with their take over and declaration that they "are the Chair".

The Justice Center is necessary, as promised, for any positive growth in the Rockwood area and I urge that it be passed again as proposed.



I am Becky Steward, President AFSCME Local 88. Thank you for the opportunity to share my thoughts and concerns today.

The resolution for the supplemental budget is a routine part of County business. Each year requires adjustments due to changes in revenue – up, but recently mostly down.

This proposal includes buying down a building debt; creating a stabilization reserve, there has been a proposal to share money with the schools. When I review these items individually they seem like good ideas. But when I review where we are this year, I have serious concerns. This year is different:

- The County is facing a huge adjustment with the sunset of the I-tax monies, resulting in service cuts to the citizens and community.
- This is the second year of using the priority based budget process, reviewing the work from the priority teams and seeking additional community/public input.

With the exception of the money set aside for the bridge, which will safeguard the Federal funds, I respectfully request you reconsider allocating any money at this time and allow it to be reviewed and worked through the budget process, where the difficult job of looking at all the services provided to our citizens will be reviewed and ranked and the tough decisions of what program and services will be funded and which will not can be made.

FY 2006 SUPPLEMENTAL BUDGET MESSAGE

Supplemental Budget

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THE DOCUMENT

The document consists of three sections:

1. The budget message explaining the reasons for the changes proposed,
2. A section of detailed estimate sheets and descriptions for those actions resulting in changes in expenditures,
3. A financial summary of the resources and requirements being changed by fund.

BUDGET MESSAGE**REASONS FOR CHANGES**

A Supplemental Budget is the vehicle allowed by ORS Chapter 294 for the Board to address changes in financial conditions not anticipated at the time the budget was adopted. In cases where no fund's expenditures are increased by more than 10 percent of the adopted budget figure, the law allows the Board to make additional appropriations after advertising a hearing on the Supplemental Budget. However, since this supplemental budget increases two funds by more than 10% and makes adjustments to General Fund cash transfers, the process for the supplemental budget action is to:

1. Convene the Board of County Commissioners to approve the supplemental budget for submission to the Tax Supervising & Conservation Commission,
2. Submit the approved supplemental budget to Tax Supervising,
3. Attend a Tax Supervising hearing on the supplemental budget,
4. Adopt the supplemental budget after Tax Supervising has certified that it is legal.

This FY 2006 supplemental budget recommends several actions to account for about \$21,400,000 in unanticipated General Fund revenues, as follows:

1. Record an additional \$21,400,000 revenue and corresponding expenditures in the General Fund. \$15,900,000 of this amount results from Property Tax, Business Income Tax, and Personal Income Tax revenues that could not have been foreseen at the time the FY 2006 budget was adopted. \$5,500,000 results from Business Income Tax revenues that could not have been foreseen at the time the FY 2006 budget was adopted. This revenue will be recorded as Beginning Working Capital. The supplemental budget is required to recognize the additional revenue.

Expenditures will be recorded as follows:

- a. \$8,000,000 will be transferred from the General Fund to the Willamette River Bridge Fund as an internal loan from the General Fund. This loan will be paid back through dedicated state and local gas tax and motor vehicle registration revenue over a five year period. These funds are needed to complete the

construction of the Sauvie Island Bridge. Revenues and expenditures in the Willamette River Bridge Fund will increase by \$8,000,000.

- b. \$6,000,000 will be transferred from the General Fund to the Capital Debt Retirement Fund to reduce the 1998 Certificates of Participation (COP) that funded the Juvenile Justice Complex. This action will reduce debt payments by approximately \$1 million annually until the certificate is retired. Revenues and expenditures in the Capital Debt Retirement Fund will increase by \$6,000,000.

ORS 294.450 requires an affirmative action of the Board to adjust cash transfers after the budget has been adopted. The supplemental budget is required to recognize the additional revenue and to increase appropriations in the Bridge and Debt Retirement Funds.

- c. \$3,500,000 will be set aside in the General Fund and maintained as a Stabilization Reserve against the year-over-year fluctuations in the Business Income Tax.
- d. \$3,500,000 will be set aside in the General Fund and maintained as a County Strategic Investment Reserve, for one-time projects that demonstrate efficiency gains, productivity improvements, risk reduction, increased convenience for employees and customers, and/or revenue generation improvements in County operations.
- e. Any remainder will be added to the General Fund Contingency Account.

General Fund (Fund 1000)

This action records an additional \$21,400,000 Beginning Working Capital in the General Fund, and records two cash transfers and two contingency set-asides. None of these expenditures is designed to be ongoing. They are all one-time-only transfers that are contemplated within the County's Financial & Budget Policies.

The transfer to the Willamette River Bridge Fund will allow the County to avoid additional costs that would be incurred were the County to borrow funds on the open market and, therefore, it offers a least cost option for completing the Sauvie Island Bridge replacement project. The transfer to the Capital Debt Retirement Fund will enable the General Fund to realize approximately \$1 million in annual savings that can be reprogrammed for other uses.

The creation of the Stabilization Reserve within the General Fund will help to offset annual fluctuations in the Business Income Tax (BIT). The County has undergone mid-year budget adjustments in three of the past four years to address revenue shortfalls brought about by the economic downturn and reductions in state funding. This reserve will be available in future years and will help to ensure that County services can continue uninterrupted.

Likewise, the creation of the Strategic Investment Fund within the General Fund will be used to encourage innovation in program development. Innovations could consist of cost reduction measures, program redesign, or development of alternative methods of service delivery to cite a few examples. If successful, programs funded with "seed" money from the Strategic Investment Fund would demonstrate a payback in terms of cost savings or increased revenue to the County.

Local Budget Law:

Once a district adopts its budget it is limited to expenditures detailed in the Resolution Making Appropriations unless formal action of the governing body is taken to amend the budget (ORS 294.435(4)). Amendments can be "minor" or "major" depending on the degree of the change. For increases in appropriation authority, if the total increase in authority is 10 percent or greater of the appropriations in a given fund, the district must hold a public hearing (major). If the increase in appropriation authority is less than 10 percent the district need only pass a resolution or ordinance (ORS 294.480). If the district is transferring authority from general operating contingency to an expenditure line item within the same fund and the amount of the transfer is greater than 15 percent of the fund's total appropriation authority, the district must hold a public hearing (major). If the transfer of general operating contingency is 15 percent or less the district need only pass a resolution or ordinance (ORS 294.450).

For both major and minor supplemental budgets the district must publish a notice of the meeting where the action will be discussed, either at a public hearing (major) or during a regular meeting of the governing body (minor). A summary of the changes to be considered is required to be included in the public notice.

Taxing districts in Multnomah County, rather than conducting a public hearing on major supplemental budgets, are required to submit the supplemental budget to TSCC. TSCC conducts the public hearing instead of the district.

Summary:

Multnomah County is increasing its 2005-06 Adopted Budget by a net of \$21,400,000.

On the resource side, \$15,700,000 of the increase is attributable to higher than anticipated revenue in 2004-05 that is being recognized as higher beginning fund balance in 2005-06. The remaining \$5,700,000 of the increase is due to increased projections for the Business Income Tax over the amount budgeted for 2005-06.

On the expenditure side, appropriations in three funds are increased by \$8,000,000 for capital outlay on an existing project; \$6,000,000 for higher principal payments on existing debt; and, \$7,400,000 for one-time projects and unanticipated needs.

The 2005-06 Supplemental Budget makes two primary adjustments to revenue in the General Fund and then disperses most of the revenue to two funds – the Willamette River Bridge and Capital Debt Retirement funds.

The first revenue adjustment is for \$15,700,000, due to higher than anticipated revenue in 2004-05 that is being recognized in the 2005-06 budget as beginning fund balance. Most of the \$15,700,000 is attributed to the business income tax (\$10,374,817), although personal income tax (\$3,580,808) and property taxes (\$2,225,846) also contributed to increased revenue in 2004-05. (Some revenue sources came in less than budgeted so that the net increase in revenue is \$15,700,000.)

The second revenue adjustment projects that business income tax receipts will continue to come in stronger than previously anticipated in the budget. The Supplemental Budget recognizes an additional \$5,700,000 in revenue from the business income tax during the current fiscal year.

The County will distribute the resulting \$21,400,000 in the following ways: as interfund transfers to the Willamette River Bridge and Capital Debt Retirement funds, earmarked as a Stabilization Reserve and County Strategic Investment Reserve in the General Fund contingency, and to General Fund contingency.

Willamette River Bridge Fund – Sauvie Island Bridge

The Supplemental Budget allows for an interfund transfer of \$8,000,000 from the General Fund to the Willamette River Bridge Fund for construction of the Sauvie Island Bridge. The transfer will be treated as an internal loan that will be repaid over a five year period from dedicated gas tax and motor vehicle fees. The County explored multiple options – from use of federal appropriations to issuing debt on the open market – to finance a portion of the project's cost. The interfund transfer is the most cost effective of the options explored.

Capital Debt Retirement Fund – Series 1998 Certificates of Participation

The Supplemental Budget transfers \$6,000,000 from the General Fund to the Capital Debt Retirement Fund to pay additional principal on Series 1998 Certificates of Participation. The certificates funded construction of the Yeon Shop (estimated balance \$2.5 million), North Portland Health Clinic (estimated balance \$1.9 million), and Juvenile Justice Complex (estimated balance \$15.8 million). The County estimates the one-time additional principal payment will reduce the debt service by about \$1,000,000 annually until the debt is retired.

General Fund contingency – Stabilization Reserve

The County proposes to set aside \$3,500,000 in a Stabilization Reserve as a future buffer against business income tax fluctuations and other state revenue shortfalls, as experienced in three of the last four years.

General Fund contingency – County Strategic Investment Reserve

The Supplemental Budget establishes a \$3,500,000 County Strategic Investment Reserve to encourage program efficiencies and potential cost savings or increased revenue for the County.

General Fund contingency

Lastly, the Supplemental Budget places \$400,000 in General Fund contingency for unanticipated expenses.

Questions:

1. It is a pleasure to be here to discuss budget adjustments created by greater than expected revenue, instead of the other way around. Can you briefly describe to us how you came to experience this "windfall"?
2. In the narrative, you mention that it is difficult to project the Business Income Tax (page 5). Is this primarily due to the economy? What other factors play into these projections?
3. The County Strategic Investment Reserve sounds like an innovative program. Can you describe how it will work – for example, what process will be used to allocate funds, will part of the funding be used as an incentive for employees to generate efficiency ideas, and is it required that the project recoup a certain percentage of the investment through efficiencies?

How (and when) will each project be reviewed to determine if the requirements for funding were met?

4. The Supplemental Budget includes \$6,000,000 to pay down certificates of participation, saving you approximately \$1,000,000 annually until the certificate is expired. How will the remaining debt be re-structured to realize \$1.0 million annually?

What are the total savings over the current payment schedule?

5. With the additional \$8,000,000 allocated to the Sauvie Island Bridge project, you have more than doubled the current capital outlay budget. You also mention in the narrative that this action will allow you to avoid the cost of borrowing funds on the open market (page 5). Will the \$8,000,000 interfund transfer allow you to replace an existing revenue source, or are you planning on spending \$16,000,000 on construction this year?
6. This supplemental budget makes very large adjustments mid-year. What is the benefit to recognizing this revenue now as opposed to waiting for the upcoming budget period?
