### 1. What action are you requesting from the Board?

Adoption of resolution updating food, pool, and tourist/traveler facility license fees.

This action will allow for recovery of administrative costs. A comprehensive staffing needs analysis was performed identifying the appropriate inspection time for each type of inspection conducted by health inspectors. This information was used in conjunction with a state mandated formula to create license fees that reflect the time needed for performing quality inspections of all licensed facilities using a full service recovery methodology. The proposed fees are reflective of a combination of forecast and historic inspection and support-work times and associated full cost recovery methodology.

### 3. Explain the fiscal impact (current year and ongoing).

None – will allow for recovery of administrative costs.

### 4. Explain any legal and/or policy issues involved.

The proposed fees will allow for recovery of costs associated with the provision of inspections, monitoring and licensing of specific categories of food, pool, and tourist/traveler facilities in January 2016.
