Established in Portland in 1983, the Black United Fund is a philanthropic and community development institutions whose mission is to assist in the social and economic development of Oregon's low-income and minority communities, and to contribute to a broader understanding of ethnic and culturally diverse groups. Your donations enable us to provide financial support to community nonprofits throughout Oregon addressing such issues as homelessness, economic stability, youth development, healthy eating, language barriers, social justice, and more.

Recognizing the continued barriers to higher education that low-income and minority youth face, the Black United Fund developed the Think to the Future Education Initiative. The program offers a synthesis of training, exposure, and encouragement designed to guide students to success. Started ten years ago, our ACCESS Scholarship guides African American youth from high-risk backgrounds to responsible citizenship through access to higher education. It has evolved to now include our Scholarship Writing Workshop series and College Fair, targeting low-income and minority students from the Portland Metro Area and SW Washington, with one-on-one mentors, ACT/SAT test prep, youth leadership development, and upcoming cultural immersion programs.

At Global Impact, our efforts are focused on making a tangible difference in the lives of the world's most vulnerable citizens. Founded in 1956, Global Impact represents 50 of the most respected U.S. – based international development and relief charities. Every year, Global Impact charities touch over 400 million lives in virtually every developing country through disaster relief, education, health training and economic programs that promote self-sufficiency. Global Impact charities get results by providing the tools for people to help themselves.

For example:

- \$10 per pay period provides 240 children and adults in Cambodia with enough Vitamin A for a year, boosting their immune systems and fighting off infections.
- \$20 per pay period furnishes basic medications, supplies, equipment and dressings to treat 1,500 displaced citizens in Iraq for three months.
- \$50 per pay period delivers seven complete classroom kits to children in Myanmar whose schools were destroyed.
- \$100 per pay period provides emergency survival kits with food, water, blankets, temporary shelter and cooking utensils for 26 displaced families in Pakistan.

Habitat for Humanity believes in a community where everyone has a simple, decent, affordable place to live; and where poverty housing is unacceptable. The Habitat philosophy involves partnering with the community, having volunteers build or renovate simple, decent and safe homes. These homes are then sold at cost with a zero-interest mortgage to partner families who qualify for our program. Habitat for Humanity has been working in Oregon for over 25 years and has built over 1250 homes. We have 32 affiliates located throughout the entire state, many of which are solely volunteer run. Habitat affiliates now build or renovate approximately 75 homes every year for hardworking, low-income Oregon families. To date we have housed more than 6,000 people, including almost 4,500 Oregon children. Habitat for Humanity of Oregon is a State Support Organization whose mission is to develop financial and in-kind resources in support of Oregon affiliates' efforts to serve more families.

Then, Robert connected with an outreach worker at a local housing transition project funded by United Way. As a result, Robert was connected with services—including transitional housing and medical coverage—that helped put him on the path to recovery.

Your support makes it possible for United Way to fund local projects that help our neighbors like Robert achieve financial stability, access workforce training and attain living wage employment.


