**RESOLUTION NO. 01-029**

Approving Multnomah County Projects for Priorities 2002 Metropolitan Transportation Improvement Program Update

**The Multnomah County Board of Commissioners Finds:**

- a. At the direction of the Joint Policy Advisory Committee on Transportation and the Metro Council, Metro is soliciting for award of approximately \$38 million of regional flexible funds to new projects.
- b. The Metro Priorities 2002 Metropolitan Transportation Improvement Program (MTIP) Update is seeking projects that meet the 2000 Regional Transportation Plan 2040 financially constrained transpiration system needs.
- c. Multnomah County and the Cities of Fairview, Gresham, Troutdale and Wood Village have transportation capital projects that meet the Metro criteria for funding eligibility.
- d. The East Multnomah County Transportation Committee at its March 5, 2001, meeting recommended submittal of transportation capital projects for funding through the Priorities 2002 MTIP Update.
- e. This public hearing is required to allow citizen comment and input as it concerns the Priorities 2002 MTIP Update project submittal.

**The Multnomah County Board of Commissioners Resolves:**

Multnomah County approves submission of the following projects for Priorities 2002 MTIP Update funding consideration:

1.	223 <sup>rd</sup> Avenue Railroad Overcrossing right of way.	\$149,000
2.	Division Street Boulevard	\$289,000
3.	Stark Street Boulevard	\$800,000
4.	Intelligent Traffic System (signal optimization) Phase II	\$1,000,000
5.	Gresham-Fairview Trail	\$852,000
