ORDINANCE NO. 97

An Ordinance amending Ordinance No. 83 and relating  
to the definition of Sworn Law Enforcement Officer.

Multnomah County ordains as follows:

Section 1. Section 2.A.17 of Ordinance No. 83 is  
amended to read:

"17. Sworn Law Enforcement Officer: An employee  
of Multnomah County assigned to the Department of  
Justice Services, Division of Public Safety, who (a)  
holds a position in one of the following job  
classifications in the classified service of  
Multnomah County:

1. Captain;
2. Lieutenant;
3. Sergeant/Detective;
4. Identification Technician;
5. Deputy Sheriff (Patrolman); and

(b) holds a position with the county which normally  
requires more than 600 hours of service per year; pro-  
vided that Sworn Law Enforcement Officer does not include  
any person classified by the County as a volunteer or  
reserve deputy sheriff, regardless of the number of hours  
of service he may perform per year."

Section 2. This Ordinance being necessary for the  
immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety,  
an emergency is declared to exist and this Ordinance shall  
take effect upon its passage.
