A proclamation honoring School-Based Health Centers (SBHCs) 30 years of service to children and teens in Multnomah County.

SBHCs are powerful investments in the health and academic potential of children and teens. They promote whole child health by providing access to primary care and mental health services that enable children and teens to thrive in the classroom and beyond. By being located in schools, SBHCs provide access to healthcare that is safe, convenient, and affordable.

Multnomah County started the first SBHC in Oregon in 1986 at Roosevelt High School. 2016 marks 30 years of SBHCs in Oregon. The Multnomah County SBCH program has grown to include 13 SBHCs across four school districts; David Douglas, Parkrose, Centennial, and Portland Public, and serves as the pass through organization for the Benson High School Wellness Center to obtain State funds.
