



Sex Trafficking and the Business Sector

Sex traffickers and sex buyers put employers and their business partners at risk.

It's happening in our own backyard.

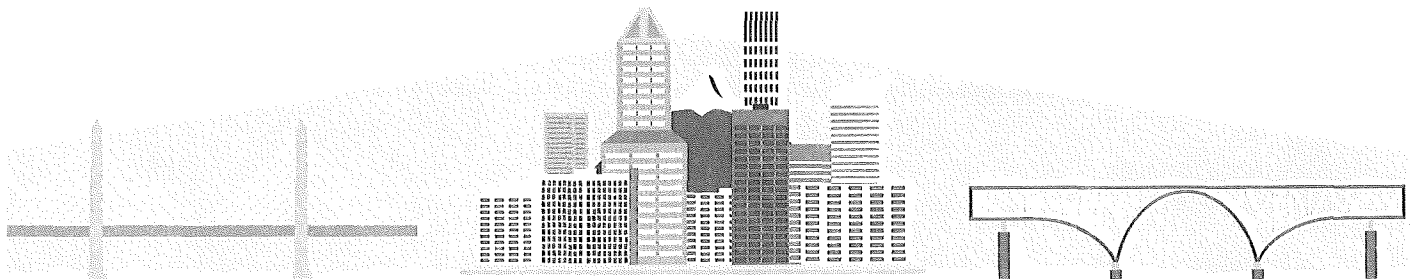
- It is estimated there are more than **11,000** attempts to purchase online sex every week in Multnomah County.
- **42**: the average number of responses to online ads for paid sex in Portland.
- The majority of Multnomah County buyers arrested are employed (**80%**), married (**52%**), have children (**64%**), and have a gross yearly income of \$50,000 or less (**58%**).
- **15%** of men report having purchased sex in their lifetime (*Martin Monto, Univ. of Portland study*).



Sex traffickers and buyers use business premises, products and services to facilitate the sale of adults and children.

Employees are soliciting sex from trafficking victims.

- According to national researchers and local volunteers who actively monitor the online marketplace, more and more men are searching for sex during work hours.
- A growing number of callers responding to decoy ads originate from local businesses.
- According to local victim advocates, the majority of local victims forced into prostitution were initially targeted as minors.



Sex trafficking causes severe harm to its victims: boys, girls and adults

According to national studies of prostituted people:

- Over **85%** are estimated to have histories of childhood sexual and physical abuse.
- Over **80%** are estimated to have experienced physical and sexual assaults, homelessness and PTSD.
- Over **89%** have reported wanting to leave prostitution if they had an alternative.
