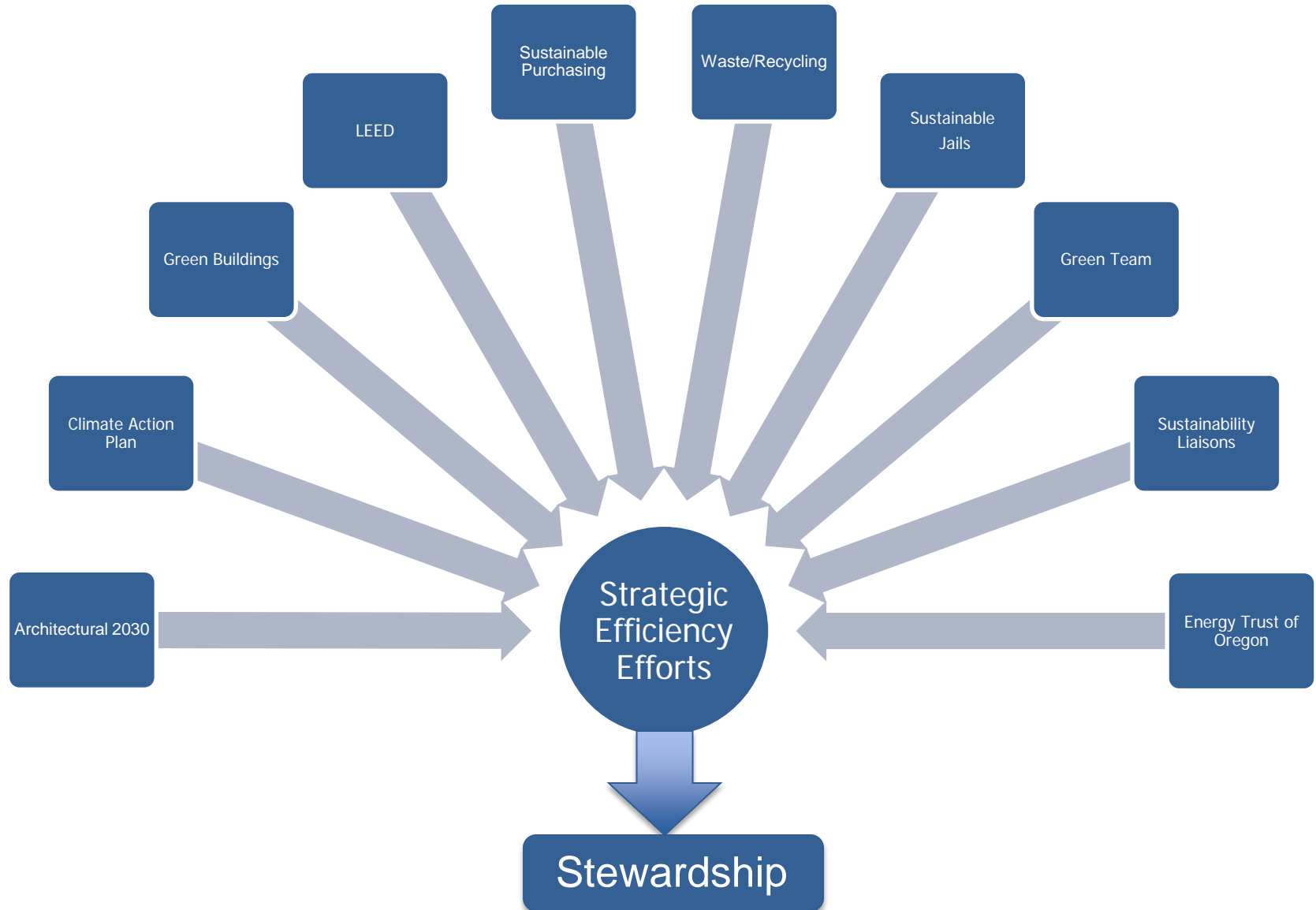

Energy Trust of Oregon // Background



Began as an independent nonprofit organization in 2002

- Serves Oregon customers of PGE, Pacific Power, NW Natural and Cascade Natural Gas
- Provides energy efficiency and renewable energy solutions to help keep energy costs as low as possible, strengthen the economy and build a sustainable energy future

Through 2012 the Energy Trust has ...

- Supported energy-efficiency and renewable energy improvements at 508,000 locations around the State.
- Participants will save approximately \$3 billion on their utility bills over the lifetime of the upgrades they have made
- They have saved/generated 478 avg. MWs and 28.2 million annual Therms – enough electricity to power every home in Portland and enough natural gas to heat every home in Bend for 18 months

- Address full range of energy related business practices

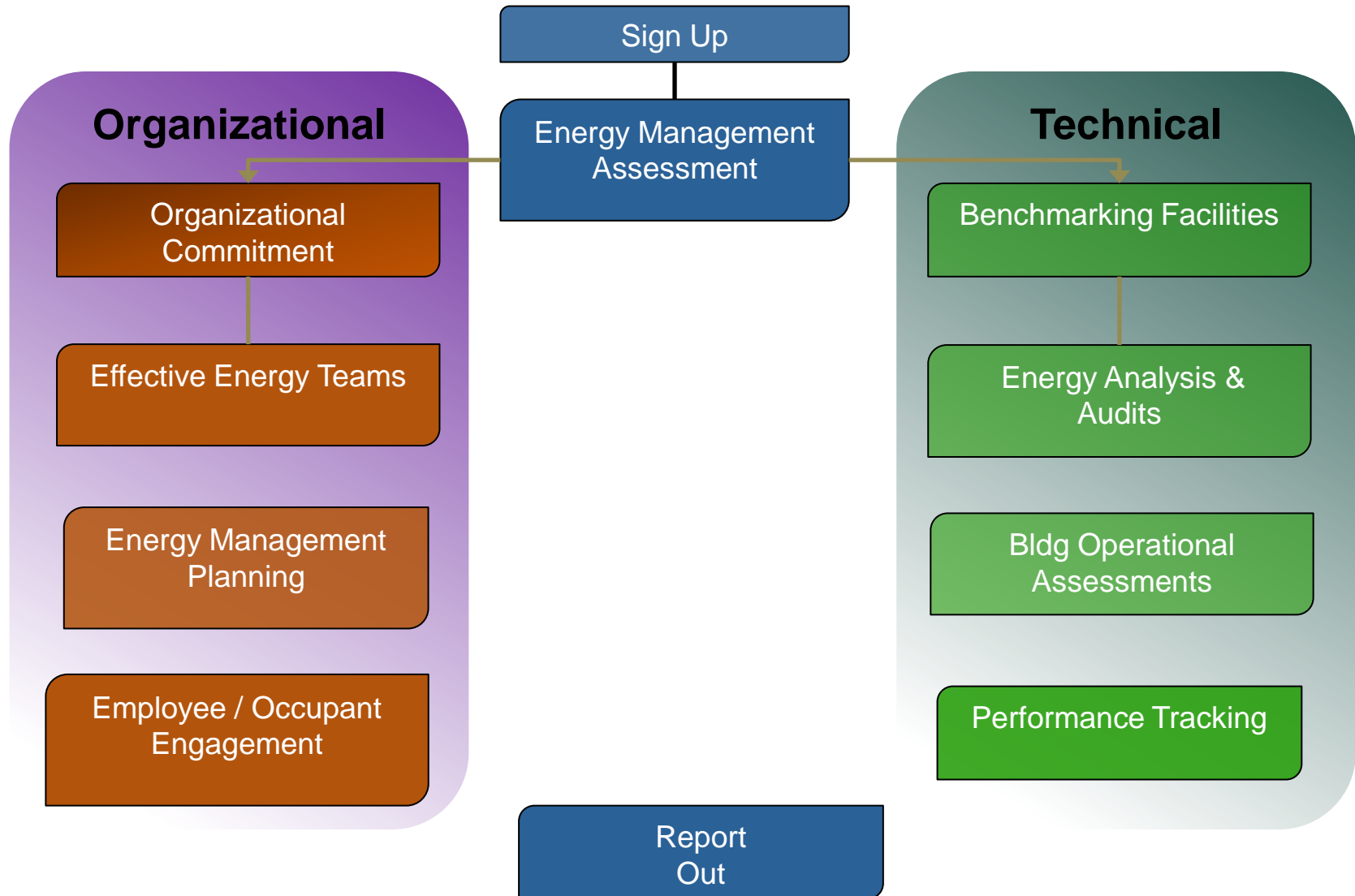
