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## **May 18. 2017 Public Testimony**

### **Multnomah County Board of Commissions**

Thank you for this opportunity to address the Multnomah County Commission as a Multnomah County voter and a volunteer with the American Civil Liberties Union.

As you may know, the ACLU has made immigrant and refugee rights a priority. Volunteers like me all over the country are asking our city, county and state officials how each jurisdiction measures up against nine model law enforcement rules and policies.

Sanctuary laws, statements and resolutions are only as good as how they work in day-to-day operations.

First, I commend the county for ease of access in getting face-to-face meetings on this important matter. I especially thank Commissioner Sharon Meieran; Hayden Miller, staff to Commissioner Vega Pederson; and Roberta Hunte, staff to Commissioner Lori Stegmann who personally met with me and/or my ACLU colleagues.

We were pleased to discover that Multnomah County policy currently covers six of the nine model rules and policies.

We also understand that Commissioner Chair Kafoury has reached out to the State of Oregon for legislative or administrative help in an effort to meet the ACLU's Defined Access/Interview Rule after incidents of Immigration and Customs Enforcement arrests at the Multnomah County Court House.

We still have concerns about transparency. The county does not have the authority to ask ICE or Customs and Border Protection to wear duty jackets or badges to clearly identify themselves at county facilities.

We also have concerns about accountability. It appears the only redress should a county employee violate county sanctuary policy would be an internal review and any punishments in line with that employee's particular union contract. No redress exists for a person without papers who is deported nor is there a process to recover lost wages or other damages if an undocumented person is detained and later released.

We hope to return after the county concludes its budget process with a longer presentation to share best practices from King County and other jurisdictions that have found ways to meet the model rules and policies.

Meanwhile, I urge the county to consider including funding for Know Your Rights training and immigration expertise in the Multnomah County Public Defender's office.

The goal of the ACLU Freedom Cities campaign is to win real protections for immigrants in our communities. We appreciate how many of the ACLU's nine model rules/policies the County already practices and look forward to continuing this discussion.
