Proclaiming May 3rd through 9th, 2015 as Construction Safety Week in Multnomah County, Oregon.

The Multnomah County Board of Commissioners Finds:

- a. Construction is vital to our strong local economy yet remains one of the most dangerous professions.
- b. The nature of the industry is fluid with craftspeople moving from firm to firm and project to project.
- c. With proper planning, communication and controls, it is possible to eliminate injuries and incidents from construction sites.
- d. No innovation in safety should be proprietary in order to send every worker across the region home safely after every shift.
- e. Local private and public owners in Multnomah County have been national leaders in construction safety.
- f. Stakeholders will enrich the dialogue and accelerate the adoption of best practices.
- g. SafeBuild Alliance, a local non-profit advocating Zero Incidents through Collaboration has encouraged all members of the building community to share and learn in safety from one another.
- h. Every day should include a focus on safety.
