House, Senate Agree On National Trails Bill

House and Senate conferees yesterday agreed on the National Trails Bill.

The bill establishes two national trails, the Pacific Crest Trail and the Appalachian Trail. The Cascade Crest Trail in Washington and Skyline Trail in Oregon are part of the Pacific Crest Trail.

Senator Henry M. Jackson, chairman of the Senate Inte-

rior and Insular Affairs Committee, said the Continental Divide and Potomac Heritage Trails will be studied for possible inclusion in the trail system.

The Pacific Crest Trail has existed since 1937, with 80 per cent of the trail in federal lands. The bill provides for trail improvements. It provides \$500,000 for land acquisition for the national trail system.




