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IMPACTS Grant

- The IMPACTS program was enacted in recognition of the shortage of comprehensive community supports and services for individuals with mental health or substance use disorders, leading to their involvement with the criminal justice system, hospitalizations, and institutional placements.
- The purpose of the IMPACTS program is to address this need by awarding grants to counties and Oregon's federally recognized tribal governments to establish evidence-based and tribal-based programs to provide needed supports and services in local communities.



Target Population

How we identified members of our target population:


High utilizers are identified as having:

- 1) four or more jail bookings within a 12 month period and/or
- 2) four or more crisis contacts with a crisis services provider (e.g Multnomah County Call Center, Project Respond, Portland Street Reponse, Unity Center/Emergency Departments).

- Telepsychiatry (Tri-County collaboration)

Program Objectives

Provide culturally responsive, trauma-informed and client-centered supports and services while individuals await longer term options in order to:

Improve health outcomes

Increase collaboration and engagement of stakeholders involved in the treatment and care coordination of individuals who are criminally/legally exposed

Decrease costs and adverse system interactions
