



Oregon Program Snapshot

Community-Based: Assertive Community Treatment (ACT)

GRESHAM, OR–TELECARE ACT OREGON: Opened in 2007, Telecare ACT Oregon is a fidelity ACT program in Gresham serving 125 adult residents (ages 18-59) of Multnomah County with serious mental illness and who may be at risk for hospitalization, have had criminal justice involvement, or who have not been successful with traditional mental health programs. Services at the program include (but are not limited to) outreach and engagement, community-based wraparound services, intensive case management, housing support, medication support and education, dual diagnosis treatment, vocational and educational services, peer support services and linkage to financial benefits. It is funded by Multnomah County Healthshare and Family Care.

Crisis: Residential

PORTLAND, OR–MULTNOMAH CRISIS ASSESSMENT & TREATMENT CENTER (CATC): Opened in 2011, the CATC is a secure 16-bed, 24/7 crisis residential program in Portland serving adult (ages 18+) residents of Multnomah County with serious mental illness. The CATC serves approximately 650 individuals annually and is funded by Multnomah County.

Longer-Term Recovery: Secure Residential

BEND, OR–DESCHUTES RECOVERY CENTER: Opened in 2011, Deschutes Recovery Center is a 16-bed Secure Residential Treatment Facility (SRTF) in Bend serving adults (ages 18+) with an Axis I diagnosis. The main purpose of the program is to provide a stable living environment for people who are transitioning from the state hospital or other secure facilities to a community-based program as a primary component of their mental health treatment. Deschutes Recovery provides services to both Psychiatric Security Review Board (PSRB) and non-PSRB residents and is the only SRTF serving clients in Central Oregon. It is funded by the State of Oregon through Medicaid and other state funding.

PORTLAND, OR–72ND AVE. RECOVERY CENTER: Opened in 2005, this recovery center serves adult males (ages 18+) with a primary Axis I diagnosis and who have had extensive institutional experiences. It is funded by Oregon Health Systems Division, Medicaid, Medicare, and private pay.

GRESHAM, OR–RECOVERY CENTER AT GRESHAM: Opened in 2002, Recovery Center at Gresham is a 16-bed Post-Acute Intermediate Treatment Services (PAITS) program in Gresham serving adults (ages 18+) with a serious mental illness who may be under civil commitment or guardianship. The program was created to help divert individuals from state hospitals, avoiding unnecessary admissions, stabilize psychiatric symptoms that prevent people from being placed in less restrictive environments, reduce length of stay relative to state hospital stays, and discharge residents into community placements and lower levels of care rather than state hospitals. It is funded by the State of Oregon.

WOODBURN, OR–RECOVERY CENTER AT WOODBURN: Opened in 2006, Recovery Center at Woodburn is a 15-bed Secure Residential Treatment Facility (SRTF) program in Woodburn serving adults (ages 18+) under the jurisdiction of the Psychiatric Security Review Board (PSRB). Funding is through Oregon Health Systems Division.

Residential: Transitional Residential Treatment

BEND, OR–12TH STREET RESIDENTIAL: Opened in 2010, 12th Street Residential is a five-bed residential treatment program serving adults (ages 18+) with serious mental illness who need 24-hour supervision and/or assistance with psychiatric recovery. The primary purpose of the program is to provide a stable home environment for people who are transitioning to more independent living. It is funded by the State of Oregon, contracted with Deschutes County Health Services.

BEND, OR–EDGECLIFF HOUSE: Opened in fall 2010, Edgecliff House is a five-bed residential treatment program serving adults (ages 18+) with serious mental illness who are in need of 24-hour supervision and/or assistance with psychiatric recovery. The program was created along with 12th Street Residential to offer similar programming and structural supports. The primary purpose of the program is to provide a stable home environment for people who are transitioning to more independent living. It is funded by the State of Oregon, contracted with Deschutes County.

PORTLAND, OR–STULTS HOUSE: Opened in 2015, Stults House is a five-bed residential treatment program in Portland serving adults (ages 18+) who need assistance in Activities of Daily Living (ADL) and are stepping down from a more institutionalized setting.
