The Audit Committee serves as the liaison between the Board of County Commissioners, the County's independent external auditor, and management, as their duties relate to financial accounting, reporting, and internal controls and compliance. The Committee assists the Board in reviewing accounting policies and reporting practices as they relate to the County's Comprehensive Annual Report. The Committee is the county's agent in assuring the independence of the county's external auditors, the integrity of management, and the adequacy of disclosures to the public.

This appointment fills an Independent Citizen position recommended by the Citizen Involvement Committee.

Membership: 7 members: Co. Chair or designee, Co. Commissioner appointed by the Chair, Co. Auditor (non-voting capacity), Finance Director (non-voting), independent citizen appointed by the Chair, 4 independent citizens recommended by the Citizen Involvement Committee, Co. Finance Director (non-voting capacity).
