Dear Mr. Bernard and Ms. Kafoury,

Effective August 15, 2017, there is a vacancy in State Representative District 38 due to the resignation of Representative Ann Lininger.

Pursuant to ORS 171.060(1) and OAR 165-010-0060, you are hereby notified of the vacancy. The Democratic precinct committeepersons of State Representative District 38 met and chose nominees to fill the vacancy. The nominees chosen are:

1. **Andrea R Salinas**
2. **Theresa M Kohlhoff**
3. **Joe Buck**
4. **Neil H Simon**

The Clackamas County Board of Commissioners and the Multnomah County Board of Commissioners must meet to appoint one person from the list of nominees. The vacancy must be filled **no later than September 14, 2017**, 30 days after the vacancy occurred. Mr. Bernard has been asked to chair the joint meeting because Clackamas County has the highest number of registered electors in State Representative District 38.

In accordance with ORS 171.062 when a vacancy occurs in a legislative district encompassing two or more counties, each county is entitled to one vote for each 1,000 of its electors or major fraction of 1,000 (more than 500 registered electors, but less than 1,000) residing within the district at the time the vacancy occurred. Based on the number of registered electors on August 15, 2017, each county commissioner is allotted the following number of votes:

County	Number of Registered Electors	Votes per County	Number of Commissioners	Votes per Commissioner
Clackamas	27,107	27	5	5.4
Multnomah	22,391	22	5	4.4

These votes are apportioned to each county commissioner. If for any reason a county commissioner is unable to attend the meeting on September 13, 2017, that county commissioner's vote would not be cast. The votes are not reapportioned for the remaining county commissioners to cast.

Enclosed is a copy of OAR 165-010-0060 outlining the procedures to conduct a meeting to fill a vacancy in the Legislative Assembly. Also enclosed is a Statement for use in notifying the Secretary of State of the appointment including signature and vote tabulation sheets. You may produce and use your own version of these documents if you wish. Please complete and return the Statement, signature and tabulation sheet immediately after the meeting. Procedure for Conduct of Meeting to Fill Vacancy in Legislative Assembly

The following procedures govern the conduct of a meeting of a county court or board of commissioners (hereafter, county governing body(ies)) to fill a vacancy in the Legislative Assembly. These meeting procedures apply to appointments made under either ORS 171.060(1) (vacancy to be filled by nominee affiliated with a major political party) or ORS 171.060(2) (vacancy need not be filled by member of a particular major political party).

(1) A meeting of the members of the county governing body(ies) shall convene at the time designated by the Secretary of State. If the legislative district includes more than one county, the Secretary of State shall also name the temporary chairperson for the meeting and designate its location, which shall be within the legislative district. The Secretary of State shall also notify the county governing body(ies) of the nominees and of the number of votes apportioned to each member of the county governing body(ies) under ORS 171.062 and 171.064.

(2) The chairperson conducting the meeting shall open the meeting at the time designated by the Secretary of State. The chairperson shall announce that the purpose of the meeting is to appoint a person to fill the vacancy in the Legislative Assembly. If applicable, the appointment will be made from the list of nominees from the major political party as furnished by the Secretary of State.

(3) Members of the county governing body eligible to vote on the selection are those physically or electronically present at the meeting, who are currently holding office by election or appointment.

(4) The county governing body(ies), in making its determination, may allot time for interviewing nominees or applicants and for other pertinent deliberations prior to voting.

(5) The vote shall be taken in a manner specified by a majority of those present and eligible to vote on the selection. The person receiving the highest number of votes shall be the appointee. However, in any case, the vote of each member of the governing body(ies) shall be recorded and included in the written statement required by ORS 171.060(3).

(6) The Secretary of State hereby adopts form SEL 145, Statement of Nominee's Willingness to Serve, as the form to be used to accept a nomination to fill a legislative vacancy. The form shall contain:

(a) Nominee's name;

(b) Office and district number, if any, for which candidate would accept appointment;

(c) Candidate's residence address;

(d) Candidate's home and work telephone numbers;

(e) Mailing address where all correspondence will be sent;

(f) Statement that candidate will accept appointment; and

(g) Candidate's signature and date signed.







I am a 73 year old woman who was out of politics for many years due to a long term chronic illness. Luckily for me, just a few years before the presidential primary my health started to improve. And soon I was galvanized by the issues that Bernie spoke about so well and so consistently. I'm not alone. Thousands of Berners went to his three speeches here in the Portland area and after the primary we didn't give up on the issues, bringing hundreds of Berner PCP's in the Clackamas Democrats. We subsequently became the majority there and voted in a Chair with Bernie's vision for change. Berners want a party based on leading from the bottom-up rather than the establishment status quo of top-down leadership. We want Servant Leaders, who put the good of citizens first. We are very tired of Career Leaders, who say what the citizens want to hear during the election process and then do whatever seems expedient for their careers once they are on the job.

Re: Appointment of Councilor Kolhoff as Representative for House District 38

Dear Commissioner Meieran:

This is regarding the appointment of a replacement for Representative Ann Lininger. I would urge you to appoint Councilor Kolhoff as State Representative for House District 38.

While I don't live in District 38, I write to you as a resident of Multnomah County District 1 (barely—I live at SE 37th & Hawthorne).

Additionally, I don't know anything about District 38 or who else may be in consideration for the position. However, I have known Ms. Kolhoff for a long time (really long, sadly—side effect of getting older) and believe she would make an excellent addition to the Oregon House of Representatives.

I first met Ms. Kolhoff in 1990, when I was an extern for federal Judge Owen Panner. At that time, she was representing a client who had a difficult 42 USC 1983 civil rights case against the Oregon Dept. of Corrections. At the time, I was impressed by Ms. Kolhoff, who put together pretty much as good

of a case as could have been put together, given the facts.

Years later, after I had passed the Bar and was working for Gervurtz Menashe and practiced family law, by coincidence, Ms. Kolhoff and me were opposing counsel in what promised to be a ridiculously complicated divorce. I represented the wife, who had had a reasonably good job—but the wife also just had twins. She didn't make anywhere near enough money to pay for infant daycare. Ms. Kolhoff represented the husband, who was an aspiring professional football player.

Our joint problem was that for the last few years, the husband had been signed for training camps—but cut before the first game of the NFL preseason. My memory is that during training camp, the husband was paid something ludicrous: maybe bed, board, and \$800 a month. But if the husband were kept on the team, even during preseason, he'd make over \$30,000 a week—some large amount.

So, in the heat of a very emotional, contentious divorce—one involving twin babies, maybe six months old—Ms. Kolhoff and me needed to craft some kind of agreement that would set child support based on husband making either nothing OR hundreds of thousands of dollars a year (maybe)...with probably no other options in-between.

Ordinarily, a case like that would be a recipe for disaster—especially because neither of the clients had any money for a protracted court case. However, I remember we all sat down, came to an agreement about what the facts of the situation were, and then pounded out a fairly complicated verbal flowchart about how child support would be calculated, depending on the success of husband's career as a professional athlete.

Soon after we settled that case, I left Gervurtz Menashe, and started practicing insurance defense law. But a friend of mine who still worked for Gervurtz told me that the football player husband later was picked up by an NFL team, and did have a brief career in the NFL. My friend told me that the complicated agreement Ms. Kolhoff and I drafted did work, so when the husband started making serious money, the level of child support was easy to adjust—without further court appearances.

More recently, when Ms. Kolhoff contacted me about her run for Lake Oswego City Councilor, I told her I was happy to support her bid.

That's why I am now urging you to appoint Theresa to finish the rest of Ann Liniger's term in the House. In my experience, Theresa not only has a good heart, and is very capable at resolving complex problems, she also is able to step up to nightmarish scenarios and keep conflicts from becoming personal. Just my personal opinion, complex problem solving skills and good hearts really aren't all that difficult to find....but people who can face the seemingly impossible, while maintaining good humour and not allowing the conflict to become personal or get sidetracked—that's an unusual talent.

All in all, as I mention above, I believe Theresa would be a valuable addition to the House.

Dear Commissioner Meieran,

As Precinct Committee Persons for the Democratic Party in Oregon House District 38 and residents of Multnomah County District 1, we are writing to share with you our concerns about the appointment process for filling the vacant seat of Rep. Ann Lininger.

1. We were surprised and disappointed by the lack of opportunities to engage the seven candidates in a free-wheeling discussion of the issues before the entire group of PCPs. At the candidates' forum and nominating convention on August 14, the Democratic Party officials chairing these two events drafted and enforced agendas that allowed no questions from the floor. As a result, PCPs were provided with little more than prepared statements from the candidates, without any chance for give-and-take, before we had to cast our votes. When one of us (Sharon) moved to allow a brief period for questions, her motion was voted down, thanks to virtually unanimous opposition by supporters of one particular candidate.
2. That candidate was Andrea Salinas, a paid lobbyist who is widely believed to be the chosen candidate of the Democratic Party leadership. By all appearances, the effort to prevent questioning before the entire group was designed to shield Ms. Salinas from having to address issues surrounding her lobbying activities as a vice-president of the firm Strategies 360. We feel it would be highly inappropriate to appoint someone to represent the people of District 38 who is currently employed by a firm that represents interest groups and major corporations. In our view, this would constitute a conflict of interest – especially egregious, considering that the airing of this issue among PCPs has been restricted and, for their part, the voters have been kept entirely in the dark.
3. We are especially troubled that Ms. Salinas has been a lobbyist for Express Scripts, a pharmacy benefit manager with annual revenues totaling more than \$100 billion annually. As a physician yourself, you know that such companies do a lot more than administer prescriptions. By determining formularies, setting drug prices, and profiting as middlemen, they are among the major players responsible for the runaway expense of our health care system. According to *Barron's*, in 2015 Express Scripts siphoned off an average of \$5.43 for each of the 1.3 billion prescription claims that it handled. Not surprisingly, the company has a vested interest in opposing single-payer health care and it strenuously opposes government regulation of drug prices.
4. At the nominating convention, when it became clear that no questions would be allowed from the floor, one of us (Jim) approached Ms. Salinas during a break to ask how she could reconcile her expressed support for single-payer with her work as a registered lobbyist for Express Scripts, as reported on gov.oregonlive.com. In response, she denied representing the company and said she was glad to learn the source of this unfounded rumor, which other PCPs had also asked her about. She was so adamant about this supposed mix-up that we were almost convinced. Still, we wondered how OregonLive could have gotten it wrong. So the next day we checked with the Oregon Government Ethics Commission, filed a public records request, and received a form dated January 10, 2014, and signed by Andrea Salinas, registering as a lobbyist for Express Scripts Holding Company. (A copy of the form is attached.) We find it hard to believe that she simply forgot about this registration. In conversation she also conceded that her firm, Strategies 360, of which she serves as VP for Oregon, does represent Express Scripts in Salem; presumably she has a supervisory role. Ms. Salinas has announced that she will quit her lobbyist job if

appointed to represent House District 38. Whether or not she intends to continue her employment with Strategies 360 remains unclear.

In summary, we are concerned about a process that has been less than open, transparent, and inclusive – a process that we believe was manipulated from above to discourage broad, democratic discussion. A much better approach, we feel, would have been a special election rather than the appointment of a candidate who won't face the voters for another 15 months and will do so then with all the advantages of incumbency. What's more, the complex nomination and appointment process mandated by law gives undue influence to party leaders (perhaps that was the intent) rather than to rank-and-file Democrats. Of course, we understand that as a county commissioner you have no direct power to change this system. But in the selection of a new representative for House District 38, you do have the power to choose a qualified candidate who is honest with voters and unburdened by conflicts of interest.

If you are wondering about our sympathies, be advised that we cast our votes as PCPs for both Theresa Kohlhoff and Neil Simon, although we see no major policy differences among the entire field of candidates. At this point, we are simply hoping for an appointee who can be counted on to carry through faithfully on what he or she professes to believe.



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House District 38 race shows divisions among local Democrats



Some participants see echoes of the 2016 presidential primary that divided the party

When Democratic Party Precinct Committee Persons from Oregon's House District 38 gathered on Aug. 14 to nominate a list of candidates to succeed former state Rep. Ann Linger, there was a curious moment early in the meeting when PCPs from the district's two counties appeared to be at odds with each other.

Several PCPs from Multnomah County advocated for the Democratic Party to maximize its influence by only nominating the minimum of three candidates, thereby increasing the probability of the party's No. 1 choice being picked. But they were outvoted by a larger contingent that included nearly every PCP from Clackamas County, and the body ultimately decided to choose four nominees.

The fact that the two sides of the vote aligned so closely with the two participating counties was not a coincidence, according to some of the PCPs involved. They say they felt an undercurrent of intraparty disagreement throughout the nomination process — one that seemed to echo the bitter primary contest between Hillary Clinton and Bernie Sanders that divided the Democratic Party last year.

Filling out the ranks

According to PCPs who spoke to The Review, the division along county lines stems in part from the fact that several of the Multnomah County PCPs were appointed to their positions less than a week before the convention, whereas the Clackamas PCPs had all been in place for a while.

"We found out that there were all these new PCPs that were certified to be able to vote in this nominating (convention)," said Clackamas PCP Rosie Stephens. "We don't do that in Clackamas County."

PCPs are elected every two years, but they can also be appointed by a vote from a county party's Central Committee. The Multnomah County Democrats had a regular Central Committee meeting scheduled for Aug. 10, four days prior to the convention, but the Clackamas Democrats did not.

"Ordinarily, we don't have a Central Committee meeting in August, so there was no way for us to elect PCPs once the vacancy was announced," explained Peter Nordbye, chair of the Clackamas County Democrats. "We would've had to break our bylaws to add any more."

Nordbye and Multnomah County Democrats chair Lurelle Robbins both said the situation was coincidental and an unavoidable result of the timing of Lininger's departure from the HD38 seat. But multiple candidates expressed frustration with the way it impacted the race.

"One of the first calls I made to a county commissioner in this race showed me how discouraging the process could be for someone who's not a party insider," said candidate Neil Simon, a public relations executive who lives in Multnomah County. "To be told to pack the room with PCPs up to the last minute, and that they could affect the outcome, was a red flag."

At the Aug. 14 convention, there were 41 Clackamas PCPs and 36 Multnomah PCPs in attendance. But at least 17 of those Multnomah PCPs had only been appointed four days before, leaving candidates without a lot of time to reach out to them.

"All of this stuff happening at the very last minute made it difficult for all of us," said candidate Daniel Nguyen, a Lake Oswego restaurateur. "At the beginning of the process, the idea of adding new PCPs was something I didn't think was possible. That was kind of a curveball that I didn't anticipate."




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Stephens said the late appointments impacted the ideological makeup of the Multnomah PCPs at the convention, and that the unity among the Clackamas PCPs was prompted by concerns that local progressive groups had been the most successful at using the appointment opportunity to add PCPs to the Multnomah side.

"They have taken this process and politicized it way more than it has been," she said. "The whole Bernie thing — supporters pushing to take over not just the county party but the state party, and they're doing it."

The result, she said, was that there was stronger support among the Multnomah PCPs for the candidates who were seen as the most progressive — such as Lake Oswego City Councilor Theresa Kohlhoff — while the Clackamas PCPs tended to favor the candidates they felt had the best shot at retaining the HD38 seat in the next regular election, such as Lake Oswego political consultant Andrea Salinas.

That ideological split was at the root of the disagreement about whether to nominate three or four candidates, Stephens said, because some of the Clackamas PCPs suspected that the newer Multnomah PCPs were seeking to limit the nominees to three and then vote as a block to nominate three of the more progressive candidates — ensuring that one of them would become the appointee.

"I think there was concern that if there were just three candidates, that the three would have been the Multnomah County (PCPs' preferred) candidates," she said.



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
Questions and timing

But some of the Multnomah PCPs and other groups had concerns of their own about the HD38 nominating process, which they viewed as lacking in transparency and unfairly stacked in favor of the existing Democratic Party's preferred candidates.

"People don't want to play nice when they've been taken advantage of," said Lisa Ortiz, president of the local group Independents for Progressive Action (IPA), which was initially founded to support Bernie Sanders during the primary. "That's the frustrating part, and that's what the party can't seem to get through their heads. They think they know better."

IPA hosted a candidate forum on Aug. 10 in Lake Oswego, and Ortiz said the group felt the need to create the event because at the time, no other opportunity had been scheduled for members of the public to meet the candidates. The group endorsed Kohlhoff after the event.

A second candidate forum event was eventually added at the beginning of the party convention on Aug. 14, with Nordbye moderating. But some of the Multnomah County PCPs at the convention said they were upset that neither event gave the PCPs a chance to ask direct questions of individual candidates in a public setting.

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"I felt that there were forces at work to manipulate me into who to vote for," said Multnomah PCP Sharon Reyes. "Withholding knowledge via open and transparent questioning impacts my ability to make my own informed decision."

Shortly after the assembled PCPs voted to nominate four candidates, Reyes suggested giving each candidate four minutes to answer questions from the audience, prior to the start of voting on the nominees. That motion set off another lengthy debate among the PCPs and was ultimately voted down in favor of the default procedure, which gave each candidate two minutes to use as they wished.

Reyes' husband, Jim Crawford, was also a Multnomah PCP, and they both said their goal was to get an opportunity to question Andrea Salinas about her history as a lobbyist.

"This issue has taken on significance for Bernie Sanders-aligned PCPs in District 38 like myself," Crawford told The Review. "Andrea Salinas is widely seen as the chosen candidate of the party leadership — that is, the Clinton wing that still dominates the Oregon Democratic Party."



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
Salinas voluntarily addressed those concerns during her two-minute statement, declaring that she had only done lobbying work on behalf of causes that comported with her values as a Democrat, and she pledged to quit her current job at the lobbying firm 360 Strategies if appointed to the HD38 seat.

Ortiz also faulted the Democratic Party for choosing to host the convention at what appeared to be the earliest possible date. State law says the party must choose replacement candidates within 20 days following the departure of a state representative, but the convention was held the day before Lininger's resignation officially took effect — a decision that disadvantaged the less-experienced candidates, Ortiz said.

"If you've run campaigns before and have mechanisms and volunteers in place, you can just call them up and get them going," she said. "If you're a less-experienced person, then you don't have those things at the ready and you have to create them. The tight timeline didn't give people time to prepare."

Robbins said the Aug. 14 date was suggested by the Democratic Party of Oregon, and a DPO spokesperson told The Review that the party suggested earlier dates because the solar eclipse and Labor Day both fell during the subsequent two weeks and would have created logistical difficulties.

Next steps



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Salinas and Kohlhoff were both nominated at the convention, along with Simon and Lake Oswego City Councilor Joe Buck. The next stage in the race will come on Sept. 13, when the commissioners from both Clackamas and Multnomah counties meet to interview the candidates and then vote on a final appointee.

But whether the convention process brought the two halves of the party any closer together is unclear. There were calls from some of the PCPs at the convention for unified support for whichever candidate receives the appointment, and they were met with agreement from the crowd. But Ortiz says she's not sure if the divisions can go away so easily.

"I don't think it's just Bernie and Hillary," she said. "It's generational, it's socioeconomics — it's people who are incrementalist versus people who want bigger change. That's huge when you're looking at the two sides of (House District) 38."

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
