Declaring July 13th through July 19th, 2014 as Pretrial, Probation and Parole Supervision Week in Multnomah County, Oregon.

The Multnomah County Board of Commissioners Finds:


- a. Community supervision is an essential service for Multnomah County and our public safety system.
- b. DCJ staff treat adult offenders, youth, and families with dignity, while recognizing the right of the public to be safe-guarded from criminal activity.
- c. DCJ staff supervises over 12,500 probationers and post-prison adult and juvenile offenders annually in the community and process about 37,000 cases through our Pretrial Supervision Program.
- d. DCJ staff use best practices to deliver supervision, sanctions, and treatment resources to improve public safety and address the factors that drive crime.
- e. DCJ staff work in partnership with law enforcement and community agencies towards a shared vision of a safer community.
- f. DCJ staff respect victims' rights and work to provide services and protection for victims.
- g. DCJ staff advocate for the restoration of communities harmed by crime and delinquent behavior.






