<b>Emergency Operations Center (EOC) Updates</b>	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Situation Reports will be released daily around 6:00 pm.</li> <li>● &gt; A regional press conference was held to keep the public informed about developments in the COVID-19 response. A summary of the press conference can be read <a href="#">here</a>. Continuing press conferences have now been scheduled for every Tuesday and Thursday at 2pm.</li> <li>● &gt; Behavioral health and long-term care facilities considerations were developed for the Oregon Health Authority and Oregon Aging and Disability to inform visitor limitation policies.</li> <li>● &gt; Interim guidance was posted for long-term care facilities on the <a href="#">Multnomah County COVID-19 website</a>. The guidance offers basic facility precautions, tips for resident care planning, and employee-support recommendations.</li> <li>● &gt; A Spanish-language page is now available on the website - <a href="#">Novel Coronavirus COVID-19 en Español</a>. Additional language pages are expected to go live on the website tomorrow for other commonly-used languages in Multnomah County other than English.</li> <li>● &gt; The website has a <a href="#">new section</a> collecting guidance documents. Additional documents will be added in the coming days, including guidance for travelers.</li> <li>● &gt; 21 Multnomah County departments/divisions met to discuss Continuity of Operations Planning (COOP) needs. A follow-up meeting was set up for tomorrow with the COOP advisory team to create an action plan for meeting these identified unmet needs.</li> <li>● &gt; Curricula from the COVID 101 outreach workshops performed across Multnomah County over the past few weeks will be available for use by other jurisdictions.</li> <li>● COVID-19 informational videos are being developed in Spanish, Vietnamese, Chinese, Russian, and Somali, with other languages being planned. The videos should be completed and available next week.</li> </ul>	

- ➤Community partners were convened for the process of creating guidance for family caregivers and people experiencing homelessness outside of shelters.
- ➤Liaisons with subject-matter expertise have been identified to provide support to community organizations, businesses, and agencies. The identified liaisons will meet on Monday to coordinate situational information and continue to identify needs. The liaisons are now available to provide information to businesses, agencies, and community organizations that perform work in that sector. The list of liaisons is below, and they can be contacted by members of their respective sectors. Sectors where a liaison is not shown are not yet filled - if you are interested in serving as a liaison, please contact the Liaison Unit Leader. Please note that the cost for non-county staff interested and able to fill vacant roles will be the responsibility of their agency.

### Emergency Support Function 7: Resource Support

- ➤County Facilities has asked janitorial contractors to develop plans for hand sanitizer stations at all County occupied buildings. Janitorial staff is prepared for enhanced cleaning efforts as soon as needed.

### Emergency Support Function 8: Health & Medical

- This is a dynamic situation. Information and case counts are changing rapidly and the incident is on-going.
- CDC testing criteria for COVID-19 has changed. The Oregon Health Authority is actively working on updating Oregon's testing criteria and new guidance will be provided by the Tri-County Health Officer.

#### ➤Health Preparedness Organization (HPO)

- At this time, OR is not altering infection-control precautions and is continuing with the CDC guidelines regarding using aerosolized procedures. The Oregon Health Authority is continuing to review this with Oregon Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA). We are aware that some states (WA, for example) have adopted 'droplet' precautions except for aerosolized procedures.
- Providers who call the Oregon Health Authority (OHA) 24-hour disease reporting line will be re-routed to the Oregon Poison Center where there are doctors, nurses, and pharmacists that can respond to COVID-19 questions. That number is: 971-673-1111
