**General**

- **EOC Liaison officer** holds weekly check-ins with stakeholders to address questions and concerns, as well as share guidance as it is released.
- The EOC is guided by the equity considerations created by the Multnomah County Office of Diversity and Equity.

**COUNTY RESPONSE ACTIONS**

- Multnomah County is working with local hotels to establish alternate medical care locations. These locations are an attempt to prevent the spread of illness by increasing social distancing for people living in group housing and who are currently experiencing acute respiratory symptoms. Multnomah County is also establishing a location for those who have a positive test for COVID-19 but do not need hospitalization.
- In order to create social distancing in current shelter systems, Charles Jordan Community Center opened as a shelter with a 125 bed capacity. This does not add additional beds to the shelter system. It allows the shelter system to space people out more in the current environment and better meet the guidance on spacing provided by Health officials. Additionally, the Convention Center opened as a shelter with a capacity of 100. These are also not new beds. This capacity allows for social distancing in the current homeless shelter system designed to help flatten the curve. These shelters will not add capacity to the community's shelter system but will allow some shelters to resume intakes. Even then, as intakes resume, **these shelters will be accessed through reservation only, not through walk-ups or drop-offs.**

- A call center will begin to manage overflow calls currently being received 211 info, the health department, and other information and referral lines currently receiving calls from the public related to COVID-19.


