## General Information

### 1. What action are you requesting from the Board?

Approval of amendment to extend the existing intergovernmental cooperative agreement which establishes the Regional Coalition of Clean Rivers and Streams, which implements public outreach campaigns for stormwater quality.

### 2. Please provide sufficient background information for the Board and the public to understand this issue. Please note which Program Offer this action affects and how it impacts the results.

Multnomah County maintains coverage for stormwater management activities under a National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System Phase I permit (NPDES MS4 Phase I permit). The NPDES MS4 Phase I permit is issued under the authority of the federal Clean Water Act, through the delegated authority of the Oregon Department of Environmental Quality. A requirement of this NPDES MS4 permit is to conduct public outreach and education. In 2010, several local jurisdictions with NPDES MS4 Permit responsibilities signed a cooperative agreement to develop and implement public awareness campaigns for water quality. This amendment extends the existing cooperative agreement until March 31, 2015. The extension is part of a strategy to restructure the coalition.

### 3. Explain the fiscal impact (current year and ongoing).

Multnomah County will fund the outreach work through the ICA up to a maximum of \$1391.

**4. Explain any legal and/or policy issues involved.**

Multnomah County has a regulatory requirement to conduct public outreach and education per the NPDES Stormwater permit. The work effort identified in the ICA satisfies this requirement.

**5. Explain any citizen and/or other government participation that has or will take place.**

Regional Coalition member jurisdictions include: Clean Water Services, Clark County (Washington), City of Portland, Clackamas County Water Environment Services, and Multnomah County.
